The Bible is the most special book in the world. It is a book I from God to people.


God wrote about Himself in the Bible. He wants us to know who He is and what He is like. He tells us many things about Himself in the Bible. God also tells us about us, about

What a wonderful letter God has written to us! Read God's Word every day so you can learn about God.



WHERE DID EVIL COME FROM?

From Isaiah 14:12-15; Luke 10:18

God lives in heaven. He does not live alone in heaven. There are many angels that live there also. God created angels to serve Him and praise Him.

But one angel did not want to serve God or praise God. This angel wanted to be God. This angel's name was Lucifer, or Satan. Lucifer was very proud. He wanted to be lifted up with the glory that only belongs to God. He wanted God's power and position.

No one is worthy to be lifted up with all glory but God. God is the ruler over all things because He is eternal and He is perfect.



God will not share His power and position as the Most High God with any created thing. He is the only God.

Lucifer and his angels chose to go against the perfect God. They chose to disobey God. This is called **sin**.

God hates sin. He is holy and has no sin in Him at all. Because God is all-powerful, Lucifer could not win. Lucifer and the angels who followed him were defeated. God cast Lucifer and his angels out of heaven. Heaven is a perfect place. No sin can be in heaven.

God made a huge lake of fire called hell to punish Lucifer and his angels. God judged them because they had sinned. Now there are angels who serve God and there are angels who serve Satan. One group of angels obeys God and one group fights God.

GOD GIVES ADAM AND EVE A CHOICE

From Genesis 3:1-13

God's world was perfect. There was no evil in it. Adam and Eve were very happy in God's world. There was no sadness or anger or pain or death.

God made a beautiful place for Adam and Eve to live called the Garden of Eden. God told them that they could eat fruit from any tree in the garden except one—the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. God said that if they ate the fruit from that one tree, they would die.

One day, Satan disguised as a serpent came to Eve. He asked her if God really said they couldn't eat from every tree in the garden.

Eve told the Serpent that God said they could eat from the trees of the garden. But if they ate from the tree in the middle of



the garden, or even touched it, they would die.

"You will not surely die," the Serpent lied. He told Eve that God did not want them to eat the fruit because it would make them as wise as God.

Eve did not know what to do. Should she obey God? Or should she believe what the Serpent said? Eve looked at the fruit. It did look good. Eve took a piece of fruit from the tree and took a bite. Then she gave some to her husband, Adam. He ate some too.

Adam and Eve suddenly realized they were naked. They sewed fig leaves together to try to cover themselves. When God came to talk with them, they hid from God in fear and shame.

God knew that Adam and Eve had eaten the fruit. He knew they had disobeyed and done wrong. Adam and Eve had sinned.

God came to the garden to find Adam. He asked Adam if he had eaten fruit from the tree that God told him not to eat from.

Adam blamed Eve. Eve blamed the Serpent. Because God is holy, He must punish sin. First, He punished the Serpent. He cursed the Serpent and said he would have to crawl on his belly with no legs forever.

God then had to punish Adam and Eve because they had sinned. Men would have to work very hard to get food to eat. Women would have pain when they have babies.

And everyone would get old and die. How terrible Adam and Eve felt. God sent them away from the beautiful garden He had made for them, and they could never come back. They could not talk with God like they did before. What could they do to make things perfect again?

Satan hates God. He tries to get people to go against God. He wants people to disobey God and follow him instead.

But God had a plan of salvation. God made this plan so people would be able to fellowship with Him like He created them to do. He made a plan that would win the fight over Satan.

This plan was a **Savior** who would win over evil. The Savior would break Satan's power over man.

God hates sin, but He does not hate people. Even though we all sin, God loves people very much. He loves you. Thank Him for His plan of salvation.

CAIN AND ABEL GIVE GOD A SACRIFICE


From Genesis 4:1-16

God wants you to obey Him. When you do right, you are serving God.

If we want to be accepted by God, we must come the way He says is right.

But there was one man who did right. His name was Noah. God chose to keep Noah safe.

God told Noah that great rains would come. The whole earth would be flooded. Noah did not even know what rain was! It had never rained on the earth before.

But Noah believed God. When God told Noah to build a huge ship, Noah obeyed.

He built this ship exactly as God told him to build it. It was called an ark.

God then told Noah to take 2 of every kind of animal on the ark. Those animals would not die in the flood. That is why Noah's ark had to be so big! After the animals were all inside the ark, God told Noah and his family to get into the ark. The flood was coming. Noah and his family obeyed. No one else got into the ark. Then God shut the door.

It started to rain, and it kept raining. It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. The rains flooded the whole earth. The water covered the highest mountain. All the people on the earth died.

But God took care of Noah and his family. When the water had gone down, Noah and his family left the ark. God had saved them from the flood.

God also gave Noah a special promise. God put a beautiful rainbow in the sky. God promised that He would never again destroy the whole earth with a flood. Whenever Noah saw the rainbow in the sky, he was reminded of God's promise. Noah thanked God and praised God for taking care of them.

Noah and his family were saved because they believed what God said. God took care of Noah and his family. God blessed them because they had faith and believed in Him.

When you tell people about God and His Word, sometimes people may laugh at you or make fun of you. If they do, just remember Noah. He obeyed even when people did not believe him. God will help you to obey Him even if it is hard.

GOD MAKES MANY LANGUAGES


From Genesis 11:1-9

From Genesis 12:1-9, 13:1-18

One day, God talked to a man named Abram. God told Abram to leave his country and his friends and family. God was going to show Abram a new land. Abram did not know how to get there, but God did.

So, Abram packed up his things and left. His wife and his nephew, Lot, went with him. They traveled until they got to the place where God wanted Abram to live. It was called Canaan.

Abram and his nephew, Lot, both became very rich in this new land. They had many animals. In a few years, they had so many flocks and herds that they needed more room. The land was getting too crowded and the people in charge of the animals were getting angry with each other.



Abram was wise. He told Lot that they should separate. But he did not want to fight over the best land. Abram said that Lot could choose first. If Lot went to the left side, Abram would go to the right side. If Lot went to the right side, Abram would go to the left.

Sometimes God may want you to do something that does not seem to make sense. Other people may not understand. If they do not believe in God, then they will not understand why you want to obey Him.

But do not let that make you afraid to obey God. God always does what is best for the people who love and obey Him (Romans 8:28). He took care of Abram, just as He promised.

God will take care of you too. He always keeps His promises.

THINK ABOUT IT:

Do you believe God's promises?

Sarah did not believe God at first. She laughed when God told her she would have a baby. She was too old to have a baby. It was impossible!

God is all-powerful. He knows everything. He sees everything, everywhere. He knows all about us and what we need. He is perfect.

From Genesis 18:16-19:29


When Lot moved away from Abraham, he went to live in a nice, green land. It was pretty, but it was not a good place. Lot had moved close to a very bad city. This city was called Sodom. The people there were very wicked.

Lot did not move away from the bad city. Instead, he moved closer and closer. Then he moved inside this

wicked city.

God told Abraham that He was going to destroy Sodom and another city called Gomorrah because the people were so wicked. Abraham asked God not to destroy Sodom if He could find 50 people in the city who were not wicked.

God said, "If I find in Sodom 50 righteous within the city, then I will spare all the place for their sakes."



What if there were only 45? God said He would not destroy it for 45. Abraham then asked about 40, then 30, then 20, then all the way down to 10. God said, "I will not destroy it for the sake of 10."

But there were not even 10 people in the city who obeyed God. But God still loved Lot. He sent 2 angels to Lot's house. They told Lot to get his family out of the city because God was going to destroy it.

Lot went to his daughters' husbands. He told them what the angels said. They did not believe Lot.

God was going to destroy the city with fire very soon. The 2 angels took Lot and his wife and his 2 daughters out of the city. The angels said, "Escape for your life! Do not look behind you."

Lot and his family left the city. But Lot's wife stopped. She looked back. Right then, Lot's wife turned into a pillar of salt. She should have obeyed God.

But God was merciful to Lot. Mercy is doing good to others when they do not deserve it. Lot had done wrong. He deserved to be punished. But God had mercy and saved Lot's life.

God is merciful to us too. Many times we do wrong. We do not deserve God's forgiveness. We do not deserve God's plan of salvation.

God did not make His plan of salvation because we deserved it. God made this plan because He loves us.

But we must follow God's way. Lot's wife disobeyed. The angels told them not to look back. She looked back and turned into salt. But Lot and his daughters were safe because they obeyed. God was merciful to them.

Imagine that you saw someone drowning. You go to help them. You hold out your hand and shout, "Grab my hand!" The person does not want to die, but if he does not grab your hand, he will drown. If he tries to save himself his own way, he will drown. He must do what you tell him to do.

God has made a way to give mercy to all people. He tells us in His Word how we can be forgiven of our sins. He made His plan of salvation so we could be saved from sin. His mercy is there for us if we will take it. When we come to God His way, we are saved.

GOD ASKS ABRAHAM TO GIVE UP HIS SON

From Genesis 22:1-18: Hebrews 11:17-19

God had made a special promise to Abraham that his descendants would be more than anyone could count.

God had given Abraham and Sarah a son, just as He promised. His name was Isaac. Abraham loved Isaac very much.

But one day, God gave Abraham a test. He told Abraham that He wanted a sacrifice. God told Abraham to take his only son, Isaac, and sacrifice him to God.

Early the next morning, Abraham and Isaac and 2 servants went to the mountain God had chosen. When they got to the mountain, Abraham told his servants to wait there. He said that he and the boy would go and worship God, and then they would come back.

He did not know how God would, but Abraham still believed.

God did not want Isaac to die. He wanted to know if Abraham would have a holy and reverent fear of God that meant obeying no matter what. Abraham obeyed, and God gave him a ram as a substitute sacrifice. God blessed Abraham for obeying. God promised that the whole earth would be blessed because Abraham obeyed. God was still working His plan of salvation for a Savior to come. Abraham and Isaac were part of the plan.

From Genesis 25:23-34, 27:1-45


saac and Rebekah had 2 sons. The first son was named Esau. The second son was named Jacob. Isaac loved Esau most, but Rebekah loved Jacob most.

Since Esau was born first, he would someday get his father's inheritance. This was called the birthright. But one day, Esau was so hungry that he traded his birthright to Jacob for some stew.

When Isaac was old and could no longer see, he called Esau to him.

He told Esau to go and cook his favorite meal. Then Isaac would give Esau the birthright and blessing before he died.

Rebekah heard what Isaac had said. She quickly cooked Isaac's favorite food. While Esau was out



hunting, Rebekah told Jacob to take the food in to his father.

Jacob knew that Isaac, his father, would know he was not Esau. He said, "Esau my brother is a hairy man, and I am a smooth-skinned man." So, Rebekah put the skins of goats on the backs of his hands and on his neck.

Isaac could not see if it was Jacob or Esau. He asked who was there. Jacob said, "I am Esau your firstborn."

If Jacob had waited for God, maybe he would not have had to leave his home and run away.

It is the same with you. Maybe there is something that you want very much. You want it so much that maybe you even want to lie or deceive to get it.

Deceiving is sin. Do not lie or deceive. Pray to God instead. Tell God all about it. If God wants you to have that thing, He will make a way for you to have it without deceiving. If He does not make a way for you to have it, He has a good reason why you should not have it. Trust Him and do what is right.

JACOB HAS A DREAM


From Genesis 28:10-22

Jacob's name means "deceiver."

Do you sometimes deceive people? Are you a deceiver? Any time we deceive others, we are serving Satan. The Bible calls Satan a liar and the father of lies (John 8:44). He deceives people whenever he can. Satan wants us to deceive others.

Satan is a liar, but God is truth. God never lies. He wants us to be truthful too. When we are truthful, we are serving God.

If you have deceived people before, but now you want to do what is right, talk to God about it. God can help you to be truthful. God wants what is best for you. God wants you to trust Him. God can change you if you will let Him.

Joseph's brothers were jealous because their father loved Joseph more than them. They hated Joseph.

One day, Joseph told his brothers about a dream he had. He dreamed that the sun, moon, and 11 stars bowed down to him. Joseph's brothers and his father did not like the dream. Did it mean that one day Joseph's father, mother, and 11 brothers would bow down to him? Joseph's brothers hated Joseph even more because of his dreams.

Jacob sent Joseph one day to find his brothers. They had taken the flocks and herds to a place far away.



oseph was doing very well in Potiphar's house. He was in Ucharge of everything.


But Potiphar's wife was an evil woman. She wanted Joseph to do a wicked thing. She tried to trick Joseph, but he told her that he would not do this sin against God. This made her angry. She told a lie about Joseph, and Potiphar put Joseph into prison.

But God was watching over him in prison. The keeper of the prison saw how God took care of Joseph and blessed him. He

prison!

One day the Pharaoh, who was the king of Egypt, sent 2 of his servants to prison. Joseph saw their sad faces. When he asked them what was wrong, they told him about dreams they had.

With God's help, Joseph told them what the



dreams meant. One servant would go back to work. The other would die. Everything happened just like Joseph said.

Two years later, Pharaoh had a dream. He was worried and wanted to know what the dream meant. The servant remembered Joseph. He told Pharaoh how Joseph had helped him when he was in prison. Pharaoh quickly called Joseph.

Pharaoh told Joseph he dreamed of 7 fat cows and then 7 skinny cows. The skinny cows ate up the fat cows.

Joseph told Pharaoh that only God could tell what the dream meant. God helped Joseph understand the dream.

Joseph said the dream meant that for 7 years there would be plenty of food to eat. Then for 7 years after that, there would be no rain. There would be no food. Joseph told Pharaoh to save food during the good years. He told Pharaoh to put someone wise in charge of saving food.

Pharaoh thought that Joseph was the best man to do this job. Once again, God had taken care of Joseph. Now Joseph was the most important man in Egypt except for the Pharaoh.

God is watching over you. He is in control, and He can turn bad things into good.



oseph was a good leader. He told the people to bring in some of their food each year to save. He helped build huge storage buildings to keep the food in. When the time of no rain came, there was plenty of food to eat in Egypt.

> Outside Egypt, other people were hungry too. They heard that there was food in Egypt. They came to buy food so they would not die.

> > Joseph's father and brothers were suffering with hunger because of the famine. Jacob told his sons to go to Egypt and buy food.

> > > When they got to Egypt, Joseph saw them and knew they were his brothers. But the brothers did not know

Joseph.

He looked very different now.

Joseph wanted to see if his brothers had changed. Joseph said, "You are spies!" The brothers were afraid. They might be put in prison! Joseph told them to prove that they were not spies. Joseph ordered them to go home and bring back the youngest brother, Benjamin.

Finally, they came back to Egypt with Benjamin. When Joseph saw his younger brother, he was glad. But he still did not want them to know who he was.

When the brothers left this time, Joseph secretly put his silver cup into Benjamin's sack. Then he sent soldiers to look for his cup. The guards found the cup in Benjamin's sack. Now the brothers were very afraid. They said God was punishing them for their sin against their other brother Joseph so long ago.

Finally, Joseph told his brothers who he was. He said that he forgave them. God had turned the bad thing they did into something good, saving many people's lives by making Joseph a leader in Egypt. Jacob's whole family moved to Egypt to live with Joseph. Joseph got to see his father again. They were very happy.

Joseph did not hate his brothers. He did not send them away. Joseph forgave them. He knew that it was really God who had sent him to Egypt. If Joseph had not come to Egypt, many people would have died when there was no food.

God had made the bad things that happened to Joseph turn into good.

Think of one time someone did something bad to you. The first thing you wanted to do was do something bad back to them, right? If someone hits you, you want to hit them back. If someone says mean things about you, you want to say mean things back.

It is easy to get angry when people do wrong to us. It is easy to let the anger control us. But when we let the anger control us, and we do bad things back to that person, we are not serving God. This is not what God wants.

God wants you to forgive people who do wrong to you. To forgive is to stop being angry or bitter about what someone else has done to you. That is hard to do. It may have been hard for Joseph to forgive his brothers. Think of the terrible things they did to him! But he knew God used everything for good. God can use the bad things for good in your life too.


BABY MOSES IS PUT IN THE RIVER

From Exodus 2:1-10

Many years went by. More and more Israelites were born in Egypt. There were hundreds of them, then thousands, then many, many thousands.

The ruler of Egypt was afraid. Pharaoh knew there were so many Israelites that they were becoming powerful. The Israelites were slaves to the Egyptians, but if they decided to rise up and fight, the Pharaoh was not sure who would win.

Pharaoh decided to make a law. He told the Israelites that any baby boy born to them must be thrown into the river to die. Many babies died.



One lady had a baby boy. She did not want her baby to die. She hid him for 3 months.

When she could hide him no longer, she made a basket and put the baby in it.

Then she put the basket in the river. It floated! Her daughter, Miriam, followed the basket to see what would happen to the baby. Pharaoh's daughter had come down to the river to take a bath. She saw the basket and had one of her servants get it. When they opened the basket, she saw the baby. He was crying and she felt sorry for him.

Just then, Miriam came out from where she was hiding. She asked if Pharaoh's daughter wanted her to get a woman to take care of the baby. Pharaoh's daughter said yes, and Miriam ran and got her mother. The baby's mother took care of him until he was old enough to live with Pharaoh's daughter. He became her son. He grew up in Pharaoh's house. Pharaoh's daughter named him Moses.

If you have to choose to either obey God's laws or man's laws, obey God. God is greater. His laws are perfect. Obey Him and trust Him to take care of you.

Pharaoh found out and wanted to kill Moses. Moses was afraid and ran away to the desert. He spent many years in a different land as a shepherd.

Once when Moses was walking, he saw a strange thing. It was a bush. The bush was on fire, but it did not burn up. Moses stopped to look at this. He moved closer.

The Lord called to him, "Moses! Moses!"

"Here I am," Moses said.

God told Moses to take off his sandals



From Exodus 4:27-7:25

Moses obeyed God and went back to Egypt. His brother, Aaron, went with him to help him. Moses and Aaron went to the Pharaoh, who was the king of Egypt. Moses told Pharaoh that God had sent him. He told Pharaoh that God wanted him to let the Israelites go.

Pharaoh did not believe in the one true God. He was angry. He said, "Who is the Lord, that I should obey His voice to let Israel go? I do not know the Lord, nor will I let Israel go."

The Israelites had been making bricks for the Egyptians. Pharaoh was so angry that he said the Israelites could not have straw to make the bricks. They had to go find their own straw. But Pharaoh said they still had to make as many bricks as before!

The next time Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh, God allowed Aaron to do an amazing thing to show Pharaoh God's power.

Aaron threw down his staff, and it became a snake!

Pharaoh told his magic men to do this. They threw down their staffs and they became snakes also. But then Aaron's snake ate up all the other snakes! Pharaoh did not change his mind. He made his heart hard to God. He would not let the Israelites go.

God told Moses to go to the river the next morning. The Egyptians worshipped the Nile River. Moses told Aaron to hold his staff over the water. All the water turned to blood! The water in the river and streams and ponds all became blood. The fish died and the river smelled terrible. The Egyptians could not drink the water.

But Pharaoh still would not let the Israelites go. God knew that Pharaoh would have a hard heart and not obey. God would do more things to show Pharaoh and all of Egypt that He is the only God and He is to be obeyed.

God is to be feared. To fear God is to have a holy reverence, or respect, for Who He is. Yes, He loves people very much and takes care of the people who love Him. But God is holy. His Word must be obeyed. He is perfect and any disobedience must be punished.

Pharaoh was proud. He thought he was so powerful that he did not have to listen to God. Pride is sin.

God hates pride. He says in His Word in Proverbs 29:23 that, "A man's pride will bring him low, but the humble in spirit will retain honor."

Proverbs 16:5 says that, "Everyone proud in heart is an abomination to the Lord: though they join forces, none will go unpunished."

And 1 Peter 5:5-6 says, "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble. Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time."

God had shown Pharaoh mighty things. He had let Aaron's staff turn into a snake. Then God turned the water of the Nile River into blood.


But Pharaoh was proud. He had a hard heart and would not let the Israelites leave Egypt as God commanded.

God sent more mighty miracles to show Pharaoh and all Egypt that He is the one true,

all-powerful God. He sent thousands of frogs. Frogs were

everywhere, even in their beds and ovens! People were stepping on them.

Pharaoh told Moses to ask God to



stop this terrible thing. God made all the frogs die. But even when the frogs were dead, Pharaoh would not let the people go. He would not humble himself before God.

Next, God sent gnats. Gnats were everywhere, on the people and on the animals. Pharaoh's magic men tried to do this also, but they could not.

They told Pharaoh that God was doing these powerful things. But Pharaoh would not listen. He would not let the people go. He would not obey God.

God sent more terrible things. He sent flies that ruined the land. He sent a disease on their animals and the animals died. He sent boils on the people. He rained hail down from the sky. He sent millions of locusts, and then He sent a terrible darkness.

Pharaoh still would not listen, and he would not obey. God had one more thing He would do. After that, God knew Pharaoh would let the Israelites go.

THINK ABOUT IT:

The Egyptians worshipped many, many idols. They had idols in the shapes of people and animals. They even worshipped the sun and the river. They were very religious people.

But their religion did not help them. None of their gods could keep these bad things from happening to them. None of their idols could stop God from showing His great power. None of the things the Egyptians worshipped did anything to help them. Pharaoh's magic men could not do what God did. Even they finally said that these things were coming from God.

God is not an idol, a statue, or a carving. He is the living God. He cannot be put into a statue for He is everywhere. He cannot be made into an idol for He is a Spirit. He is greater than the carvings people make. Idols cannot answer prayers or help people. God showed the Egyptians that they were wrong.

God showed all of Egypt and all of Israel that He is the one true God. He is above all gods. Only the Creator God is to be worshipped. No one and nothing else. God defeated the idols of the Egyptians and showed that He has all power.

THE VERY FIRST PASSOVER

From Exodus 12:1-30

Pharaoh had not obeyed God. He had not listened to God's command to let the Israelites go. He did not fear God even when God gave Egypt much trouble.

One terrible thing was coming. God was going to judge all of Egypt because they did not fear Him. God told Moses that the angel of death was coming on a certain night. The oldest son in every family would die. But God had a plan for the Israelites to be saved from this death. He told Moses to tell this plan of salvation to all the people of Israel.

Moses told the Israelites to get a lamb. One lamb for each family. On this certain night, they were to kill the lamb. Then they were to put some of the lamb's blood on the sides and tops of the doors of their houses.

After they put the blood on the doors, they would cook the

lamb and eat it.

The angel of death would come that certain night to kill every oldest Egyptian son. But if he saw the blood on the door of a house, he would pass over that house. Their oldest son would not die.

Every Israelite who believed what God said obeyed. They killed a lamb and put its blood on the sides and top of the doors of their houses. The angel of death came and killed the oldest son of every Egyptian family. But the Israelites had been saved, because the angel saw the blood and knew they had obeyed God.

Now all of Egypt knew that God was the only true God and He was all-powerful. Pharaoh called for Moses. He told him to take all the Israelites and leave Egypt. God had saved the Israelites from slavery. They were free! God told the Israelites to keep this Passover celebration every year to remember how God saved the Israelites and set them free from the Egyptians.

THINK ABOUT IT:

There are many times recorded in the Bible where God had people do something special as a symbol or a picture of something else.

The Passover was one of these times. The Israelites were miserable. They were slaves. Only God could set them free. God sent judgment on every person who did not obey. But He saved every person who did obey. It did not matter how many good or bad things they had done. All that mattered was if they had the blood on the doors. The blood saved them from death. It showed their faith.

This was a picture of God's plan of salvation. All people on earth are slaves to sin. No one can set us free from sin but God.

God would send the Perfect Lamb one day as a sacrifice for sin. This Lamb's blood saves anyone who believes. It does not matter how many good or bad things you have done. What matters is if you turn from your sin, believe, and accept the blood of the Perfect Lamb of God to pay for your sins. The perfect One to come and give salvation was called the **Messiah**, which means God's Anointed One. The Passover lamb was a symbol of the Perfect Lamb, the Messiah, whom God would send to save people from their sin.

Just like with the Passover, every person who obeys God's plan is saved for all eternity. Every person who does not obey God's plan will be judged and punished for all eternity.

THE ISRAELITES CROSS THE RED SEA

From Exodus 13:17-14:31

The Israelites had been set free! God had delivered them. They packed up their things and left Egypt. There were 600,000 men, plus all the women and children. Moses was the leader of all these people. God showed them where to go. God led them by a pillar of cloud during the day and a pillar of fire at night.

When someone told Pharaoh the Israelites had left, Pharaoh

changed his mind and said,
"Why have we done this, that
we have let Israel go from
serving us?" He got his
army together and chased
the Israelites.

It was not long before the Israelites could see the huge army coming.

They were very afraid.

The Israelites were trapped at the sea!



Pharaoh and his army were behind them. There was no way to escape. They told Moses they should have stayed and been slaves. Now they were going to die in the wilderness.

But Moses told the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will accomplish for you today." He told the people that the Lord would fight for them.

God hid the Israelites from the Egyptian army that night. God told Moses to stretch his hand over the sea and all that night God sent a great wind. In the morning, the sea was divided! The Israelites walked across on dry ground with a wall of water on their right and on their left.

When the Egyptian army followed them, God told Moses to stretch out his hand again. When he did, the waters crashed back together and the Egyptian army died.

The Israelites praised God for His great deliverance.

God showed the Israelites that He is a mighty God. God showed them that He is more powerful than any army. No man can stop His plan.

Sometimes things happen in your life and you do not know what to do. You have no place to run away from the problem. You have no way to fix the problem. You are like the Israelites trapped at the sea. You are worried because you cannot do anything. All you can do is trust God.

But that is the best thing you can do! God is not afraid of the problem. It is not too hard for Him. Pray and ask God to deliver you. Then wait to see what wonderful things God will do!



GOD TAKES CARE OF HIS PEOPLE

From Exodus 16:1-17:7

The Israelites traveled in the desert for a long time. They were tired and hot. They complained to

Moses. They said they were starving. They said they wished they were back in Egypt.

The Lord told Moses that He would make it rain. It would rain bread! God would give them rules about the bread to see if they would obey.

Moses gathered the people together. He told them that God had heard their grumbling. Moses said, "Your complaints are not against us but against the LORD."

Moses gave the people God's rules. When the bread came, they should only take what they needed for one day and nothing more.



They were not to keep any extra for the next day.

In the morning, there were flakes all over the ground. God had rained down bread from heaven! They called it **manna**.

Everyone took what they needed for one day.

But some people disobeyed. They kept some until the next morning. When they got up, the bread was full of bugs and it stank.

On the 6th day of the week, God's rules said to take enough bread for 2 days so they could rest on the seventh day as God had said. No manna came to the ground on the seventh day. All the Israelites who obeyed and kept some had food to eat. There were no bugs in it.

God took care of the Israelites. He also gave them water. He gave them quail to eat. He protected them and provided for them all the time they were in the desert.

God does not like complaining. Complaining does not honor God or lift God up.

God has done so much for you. You should not grumble and complain about what you do not have. Think of all you do have! You can be glad for sunshine and flowers and your heart beating and lungs breathing air. You can thank God for your friends and your family.

We should be so glad for what God has done for us that we do not even think about complaining.

God promises to give you everything you need. He has never lied before. You can trust Him to keep this promise too.

From Exodus 19-20


he Israelites came to a mountain called Sinai. God told Moses to go up the mountain. He was going to give Moses the laws for the Israelites to obey. Moses told the people and the people said, "All that the LORD has spoken we will do."

Moses went up Mount Sinai and God talked with him. God gave Moses 10 Commandments for the people to obey. God told Moses:

"I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage [slavery]."

Here are God's 10 commands:

- 1. Do not have any other gods except me.
- 2. Do not make any idols.
- 3. Do not use the name of



the Lord your God in an unholy way.

- 4. Remember the Sabbath day. Keep it holy.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother.
- 6. Do not murder.
- 7. Do not commit adultery.
- 8. Do not steal.
- 9. Do not lie about your neighbor.
- 10. Do not covet.

God talked with Moses about many things. God wrote His 10 Commandments on 2 stone tablets. He gave them to Moses.

You may be thinking that no one could keep all those laws. Everyone is going to break one of the laws sometime.

You are right.

God gave the law and the law must be perfectly obeyed. But no one can perfectly obey all the laws God gave to us. That is because no one is perfect.

You are not perfect. Even if you break only one commandment, you are not perfect. Even if you only do one bad thing your whole life, you are a sinner.

God wanted the Israelites to know that they could never be good enough. They could never be perfect like God. He knew the Israelites were sinners, but now they knew it too. They saw the law and knew they could not keep it. If we break one commandment, we have broken the law. We must keep the law in the things we think and the things we do. It is impossible! There is no way we can please the Holy God.

That is why all people need God's mercy. We need God's help, but we do not deserve God's help. The Bible calls this grace. Grace is love and care from God that we do not deserve. Grace would come in God's perfect plan of salvation. God gave us the law to show us that we need God's grace.

THE PEOPLE WORSHIP A GOLDEN CALF

From Exodus 32

Moses had been up on the mountain for a long time. The people came to Aaron, Moses' brother. They told Aaron to make them gods to lead them. They didn't know what had happened to Moses.

Aaron told the people to give him all their gold jewelry. He used the gold to make a golden calf. He told the people this was their god who had brought them out of Egypt.

The Israelites worshipped the golden calf. They danced around it and sang.



Moses was coming down the mountain when he heard the singing. Then he saw the golden calf and the people dancing and running wild around it. He was very angry.

He threw the stone tablets down and they broke into pieces. He took down the golden calf and ground it into powder. He put the powder into the water and made the Israelites drink it.

Moses called out, "Whoever is on the LORD's side—come to me!"

One of the tribes, the Levites, stood with Moses. Moses told the Levites to go kill people with their swords. About 3,000 people died that day.

God also made the people sick because they worshipped the golden calf.

Then God called Moses back to the mountain. He gave him 2 more stone tablets with the 10 Commandments on them. Moses was on the mountain with God for 40 days and 40 nights.

While God was giving His law to Moses, the Israelites were making a god out of gold! This was the very first law God gave to Moses. God said He was the only true God. They were not to have any other gods. God's second law was to never make any idols. The Israelites broke that law too. They dishonored God by making an idol. They mocked God by worshipping this golden calf.

What they did was very evil.

What would you have done if you had been an Israelite? Would you have worshipped the golden calf because everyone else was? Or would you tell them that there is only one true God and He is the only One to be worshipped? Which do you think would please God?

Sometime in your life, you will be around people who are doing things that are wrong. You need to decide if you will do what the others are doing, or if you will say no. Think right now of some things people around you might do: lying, stealing, cheating. You can think of others. Do any of your friends do these things? If you did these things with them, it would mean you care more about what others think than about what God thinks. You would be putting someone or something in God's place. The Bible says in Proverbs 1:10 that if sinners tempt us, we should not give in. Do not spend time with people who are on an evil path. Stay on God's path.

God wants each of us to follow Him with our whole heart. That means that we follow Him even when no one else does. This is pleasing to God.

GOD TELLS MOSES TO MAKE A TABERNACLE


From Exodus 40

God told Moses to make a special place. It would be called the Tabernacle. It was a place where people could come to worship God. God's presence would be there.

God gave Moses exact plans for this Tabernacle. Each item in the Tabernacle was designed by God and had important meaning.

There would be priests at the Tabernacle. Priests were men who spent their lives serving God. That was their job.

Whenever anyone sinned, he could bring a sacrifice to the Tabernacle. The priests would sacrifice the animal to God, and the person would be forgiven.



The Tabernacle was the place where people could come to ask forgiveness and to pray. God had been leading the Israelites by a pillar of cloud during the day and a pillar of fire at night. When the Tabernacle was finished, the cloud stopped above the Tabernacle.

When the cloud stayed, Israel stayed in one place. When the cloud moved, it was time for the Israelites to move. They followed the cloud. They took the things for the Tabernacle with them. When the cloud stopped, they set up the Tabernacle again.

This was how God led the people.

People had to sacrifice an animal at the Tabernacle to get forgiveness for their sin. They went to a priest who helped them offer the sacrifice exactly as God commanded. The sacrifice was a picture of something to come.

The sacrifice was a picture of the Messiah. When the Lamb of God came, He would be the Perfect Sacrifice for sin. People would not have to sacrifice animals for forgiveness anymore. They would not need a priest to help them be right with God. The Messiah would be the mediator between God and man. He would open the way for anyone to have God's grace and righteousness. He would be the way to eternal life in heaven!



TWELVE MEN SPY ON THE LAND

From Numbers 13:16-14:24

The Israelites were getting close to the land God had promised to give them. The land was called Canaan. God had promised this land to Abraham many years before. God was keeping His promise.

Moses sent 12 men to look over the land. They were to see what it was like and what kind of people lived there. When the men came back, they had a

bunch of grapes. The bunch was so big, it had to be carried by 2 people! They said that the land was very good, just as God had said.

But 10 of the men told the Israelites that they should not go into this land. They gave a bad report. They said all the



people there were like giants. They told the people, "We were like grasshoppers."

The Israelites cried and complained. They complained about Moses. They complained about God. They wanted to go back to Egypt.

But 2 of the spies gave a good report. They told the people that God would lead them into the land. God would take care of them. But the people did not believe the 2 spies. They even talked about killing them!

God punished the Israelites for not having faith in Him. God made them walk in the desert for 40 years. Only the 2 spies who believed God's promises would be able to go into the land.

That is sin. God is perfect and He keeps His promises. We need to have faith and believe that He will do what He says.



THE DAY A DONKEY TALKED


From Numbers 22-23

Wherever the Israelites went, God protected them. He made all the people in the lands around them afraid of the Israelites.

One man named Balak saw how God was defeating the Israelites' enemies. Balak was the king of Moab, and he was worried. He did not want the Israelites to defeat him.

He called to a man named Balaam. He told Balaam to come and put a curse on the Israelites, so they could not hurt him.

Balaam got on his donkey and rode to see King Balak.
On the way, God sent an angel to stop him. The angel stood in the road.
The donkey saw the angel and turned away.
Balaam hit the donkey.



The angel still stood in the way. Balaam's donkey ran into the wall on the side of the road. Balaam hit his donkey again.

When the angel stopped them again, the donkey lay down in the road. Balaam was very angry. He started beating the donkey.

God opened the donkey's mouth and she talked! The donkey said, "What have I done to you, that you have struck me these 3 times?"

Then God let Balaam see the angel. Balaam knew that the donkey had saved his life. The angel had a sword. He would have killed Balaam! The angel told Balaam to go see Balak, but Balaam must only say what God told him to say.

Balaam met with King Balak. Balak told him to curse the Israelites, but he blessed them many times instead. Balak was angry, but Balaam said, "Did I not tell you, saying, 'All that the LORD speaks, that I must do'?"

God wants to help us make decisions. He wants to show us the best way to do things. He will help us, if we ask Him.

When you must make a decision about something, pray to God about it first. Ask God to give you wisdom. Then read God's Holy Word. God will guide you. God will watch over you. No decision is too hard to make with God's help!

The gates of Jericho were tightly closed because the people were afraid of the Israelites. No one could come in and no one could go out.

But God told a man named Joshua that He was going to give the Israelites that city. He told Joshua to tell the Israelite army to go to Jericho the next day. He told them to march around the city

> one time and then come home. They were to do this for 6 days. Then on the seventh times.



Joshua told them not to say anything while they marched. They marched around the big walls of the city. The priests blew their trumpets, but the soldiers did not say one word. Then they went home.

They did this the next day and the next. They did it for 6 days. On the seventh day, the Israelites obeyed what God had said and marched around the great city 7 times. When they had finished, Joshua yelled, "Shout, for the LORD has given you the city!"

The priests blew their trumpets and the army shouted a great shout. When they shouted, the walls of Jericho fell down! The army walked right into the city. Now Jericho belonged to the Israelites.

God had helped them win a great victory!

The Israelites did not yell at the people or give up and go back. They did not understand why they were marching, but they obeyed.

Maybe you are doing something God taught you is right, but other people are laughing at you and making fun of you. They may even say bad things about you and about God.

It would be easy to get angry at them and say bad things back. It would be easy to give up. But this would not please God.

God wants you to obey Him no matter what other people think or say. What God thinks and says is the most important.

The Israelites obeyed, and God gave them a great victory.


ACHAN SINS AGAINST GOD

Joshua prayed to God. He asked why God let this happen. Joshua could not understand.

When Satan tempts you, do not give in. Do what is right and remember that God wants what is best for you.



GOD'S PERFECT LAMB

From Genesis 3:15; Exodus 20; Isaiah 53

As many years passed, God took care of the Israelites, the descendants of Abraham. God gave them rules to follow. God said that when they obeyed the rules, He would be pleased and they would be blessed.

Many times, the Israelites disobeyed God's rules. God sent them prophets, men to tell them that they needed to turn around and do right. Sometimes, the people changed. Many times, they did not. Some even hurt God's prophets for preaching the truth.

God knew the Israelites would sin. All people sin. Sin must be punished.

God says the punishment for sin is death.
That is what He told Adam and Eve back in the

beginning.



Remember the Tabernacle and the sacrifices God required? God chose a lamb sacrifice as the payment for sin. In God's system, when a person sinned, they could offer a lamb to pay the price of their sin. This lamb had to be perfect, with no spots or marks.But the Israelites knew that a lamb could not really take away their sins. Only someone perfect could make things right between God and man again. But no person on earth is perfect. Israel had to trust in God's promise.

God promised to send a Savior. God promised that this Perfect One would take the punishment for sin and then people could fellowship with God again. This perfect Someone was the Messiah, the Lamb of God.

The Israelites waited for this Savior, this Perfect One. When would He come? Would He really be able to pay for sin?





God did not explain everything to them. God knew that when the Messiah came, He would explain the truth to them. Then each person would have to choose if they would believe Him or not.

They needed a Savior to forgive their sins and make it possible to be right with God.

Many, many years had gone by since God made His first promise to Adam and Eve. But God had not forgotten. God knew when the perfect time was. The Messiah would be coming soon.

Just as the angel had said, a baby was born to Zacharias and his wife. When it was time to name the baby, the relatives wanted to name him Zacharias. But Zacharias wrote on a tablet, "His name is John."

As soon as he wrote this, he could speak again! He praised God. The people were all amazed. God had done a miracle. They wondered what kind of man this baby would be.

John grew up to be a great man, as the angel had said. He told people that the Lord was coming soon.

SIMEON AND ANNA SEE JESUS


From Luke 2:21-40


JESUS CHOOSES HIS DISCIPLES



The disciples wanted Jesus to send the people away to get food in the villages.

If you had been in that big crowd that day, would you have given your food to Jesus? The boy only had a little food. It was probably only enough for him to have one meal. It certainly could not feed 5,000 people.

But he gave his food to Jesus. He knew it was not much, but maybe Jesus could use it. Jesus did use it. Thousands of people ate from that little boy's food.

Jesus can use even little things to do great things. He can use you too. Maybe you think you are too small or too young to do much for Jesus.

This little boy had only 5 loaves and 2 fish. He gave Jesus what he had, and Jesus used it to do something wonderful.

You can give Jesus what you have, too. God has given you special talents. There are some things you can do well. You can use these talents for Jesus.

You can give your time to Jesus. You do that when you take time to be kind and do good things for others. You can share what you have for Jesus' sake. You can also give Jesus your life, and tell Him you will do whatever He wants you to do.

You may not have 5 loaves and 2 fish to give to Jesus. But you can give what you do have to Him. Even if what you give is little, God can use it to do great things!

he Pharisees and the Scribes were religious groups that hated Jesus. They wanted to kill Jesus.

One of Jesus' disciples was a man named Judas Iscariot. Judas kept the money bag, but he was a thief. Sometimes he stole the money and used it for himself.

Judas went to see the religious leaders. Judas told them he would help them arrest Jesus.


> The religious leaders were happy to hear this. The priests gave Judas 30 pieces of

> > silver. After that, Judas planned how he could get Jesus arrested.

Jesus took some of His disciples up on a mountain one night. He left them and

went to pray by Himself.

When He came back, soldiers and a crowd of people came.



The man in front was Judas. Judas had told the men that the One he greeted in a special way was the One to take.

Judas walked up to Jesus and greeted Him. Jesus knew what Judas was doing, but He did not run away. He said, "Friend, why have you come?"

The soldiers were going to arrest Jesus! Peter, one of Jesus' disciples, pulled out his sword and cut off one man's ear. But Jesus told Peter to put his sword away. It was not the time to fight. If they fought, how could Jesus fulfill all that the Bible promised must happen? Jesus healed the man's ear.

The disciples were afraid of the soldiers. Even though they had promised to be with Jesus even to death, they all left Him and ran away.

When the soldiers took Jesus away to the governor for trial, Judas felt bad for what he did. He went to the religious leaders and said, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood."

They said, "What is that to us?"

Judas threw the 30 pieces of silver down. He ran from there and hanged himself.

Now one disciple was dead and the others were hiding. Jesus was on trial and His enemies wanted Him to die. What would happen?

THINK ABOUT IT:

Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him. Hundreds of years before, God said this would happen through His prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 53) and His prophet David (Psalm 41:9). In many, many other places, like Psalm 22 by the prophet David, God gave very clear information about what would happen to His promised Messiah.

Jesus is one with God the Father and He knows everything. Nothing is a surprise to Jesus. He could have hidden in a place where Judas could not find Him. He could have gone back to heaven and never been arrested. But He knew all along that this was why God had sent Him to earth. He did not want to be hated and arrested and suffer, but He did want to do God the Father's will.

Jesus told His disciples that He would be betrayed before it happened. In Luke 18:31-33, He told His 12 disciples, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be delivered to the Gentiles and will be mocked and insulted and spit upon. They will scourge Him and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again."

Jesus knew about all the prophets for He is eternal and created them! He knew what they had prophesied about the Messiah. He knew this was God's perfect plan of salvation, and He obeyed it willingly.

JESUS DIES FOR US

From Matthew 27; Mark 15; Luke 23; John 19

Jesus had done many wonderful things. He had done many miracles. He healed sick people. He even brought dead people to life again!

Many people believed that Jesus was the Son of God. They believed that Jesus was the Messiah sent to earth. They believed He had come to be the Savior of the world.

But some people did not believe.
These people hated Jesus. They hated Him because He said He was the Son of God. They hated Him because He said that He was one with God. They hated Him most because that meant Jesus is God.

These people did not believe that Jesus was the One the Bible called Immanuel. Immanuel means "God with us."

Jesus' enemies, with Satan in their hearts and his lies in their minds, had Jesus arrested and brought to trial. They lied about Jesus and said many bad things about Him. They beat Jesus and made fun of Him. They whipped Him and made a crown out of thorns to put on His head.

After that, they crucified Jesus. They made 2 beams of wood into a cross. Then they nailed Jesus to this cross.

The people who loved Jesus could not understand. Jesus was the Savior! He was the Son of God! Why didn't He call angels to come down and fight these evil people?

But Jesus stayed on the cross. He prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

The Bible says that "Jesus, knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled ... said 'It is finished."

Then Jesus died.

How could this happen? Jesus said He was the Son of God. How could He die? He said He was the Savior of the world.

Think back to what God said about His plan of salvation. Do you remember that people had to sacrifice a lamb when they had sinned? Do you remember that no animal could really take away sin, but only a Perfect One could pay the price for sin? The price for sin is death. John had called Jesus "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).

Jesus could have stopped His enemies at any time. After Peter cut off the man's ear, Jesus said, "Do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels? How then could the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must happen thus?" (Matthew 26:53-54).

What looked like a terrible tragedy was the very reason Jesus came. He had to die to fulfill God's plan of salvation.

But how could He be the Savior if He was dead? How could God's Son be dead?

The disciples did not know what to think. They were very afraid. And they were very sad. Was their hope and faith for nothing?

What would happen?



From Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20

Jesus, the Lamb of God, had died on a cross. After He was buried, the people who hated Jesus put soldiers outside the tomb where Jesus was. They guarded the tomb because Jesus had said that after 3 days He would rise again.

On the third day, an angel came to the tomb. There was a great earthquake when the angel rolled the stone away from the front of the tomb. The guards were so afraid they fell down like they were dead.





I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead."

The women rushed back to tell the disciples that Jesus was alive!

But the disciples did not believe them.Later, Jesus came to the house where the disciples were hiding. They thought He was a ghost. Jesus showed them where the nails had pierced His hands and His feet. He told them to believe He was alive. Everything had happened just as God said it would many years ago.

The disciples were so happy. Jesus had risen from the dead! He paid the price for sin by dying on the cross. Nothing could keep Him in the tomb. Jesus is more powerful than death!

What a wonderful day. Jesus lives!



From Acts 1:1-11; Luke 24:44-53

After Jesus rose from the dead, He taught His disciples many things. Then after 40 days, Jesus went back to heaven.

Before He left, Jesus told the disciples that they should tell the whole world about Him. He told them that the Holy Spirit of God would help them do this. Then they saw Him begin to float up from the ground. They kept watching Him go up until a cloud



came and they could not see Jesus anymore. Jesus had gone back to heaven to be with God His Father.

As the disciples stared at the sky, 2 angels came. They asked the disciples, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven." Jesus had gone to heaven, but they knew that someday He would come back. He promised that when He came back, He would take those who believe in Him to heaven.

The disciples started to tell people about God's plan of salvation. They told people that everyone had sinned and the price for sin is death. They told them that God sent His Son to die for the sins of the world.
