LET'S LEARN MORE FROM GOD'S WORD

The Bible is God's Holy Word. The Bible comes from God and is perfectly true. It teaches us about Who God is, and how much He loves us and wants us to be His children.

The Bible is separated into 2 parts. The first part is the Old Testament and the second part is the New Testament.

In the Old Testament, we learn how God created the world and how He spent time with Adam and Eve. We can read in the Old Testament about how Adam and Eve disobeyed God, and sin came into the world through God's enemy, Satan.

We learn how the Lord God watched over Noah during



the great flood, and how the Lord changed man's language from one to many. We can read about Abraham, his son Isaac, his son Jacob, his son Joseph, and the many people born to them who became the Israelites. We read how God saved His people from slavery in Egypt and gave them His laws to live by.

The New Testament is about Jesus. We read in the New Testament how Jesus lived, why He died, and that He rose from the dead. There are also many letters in the New Testament written by people who believed in Jesus to His followers on how to live God's way.

This year you will read many more stories. These stories are all from God's Holy Bible. They are all true stories about people who really lived.

We can learn from these stories and the people in these stories. From the ones who did wrong, we learn what we should not do. From the ones who did right, we learn what we should do. We learn why we should obey God and what happens when we do not.

Most of all, we can learn more about God and His holy Son, Jesus Christ the Messiah. We can learn about how God loves all people very much, and how Jesus made a way so we could go to heaven. There are so many wonderful things in the Bible. Get each new lesson to learn more!

GOD IS MY CREATOR

God knows your name and everything about you. He knows your favorite colors and what food you like and what makes you feel sad or happy. He knows because He made you! He chose if you would be a boy or a girl. He chose what color your hair would be and how tall you would grow. He chose for you to be just as you are, on purpose, and He loves you exactly as you are.

God knows what you are like, but do you know what is God like?

We learn about God in the 3 ways He shows Himself.

The first way God shows Himself is in **His creation**, the things He made. Just like a painting shows us things about who painted it, like what colors the artist likes or if he is a good painter or not, God's creation shows us many things about Him.



From His creation, we see that God is very powerful and very, very smart. He is creative and likes beauty. From the seasons, we learn that He likes order. Can you think of things in creation that show that God likes music, and colors, and joy?

The second way God shows Himself to us is in **His Son**, Jesus. Jesus is called the living Word of God. He taught us that God is Light. God is love. God is merciful and good. God wants us to know Him.

The third way God shows Himself to us is in **His Word**, the Bible. In the Bible, we learn that God is eternal, everywhere, and made everything. He is more amazing than we can imagine. He has all power and all knowledge. He is holy, righteous, and will one day judge the world.

God knows you and He wants you to know Him. That is why we study the Bible!

THINK ABOUT IT

Did you know that if you pick up one handful of dirt, there are millions of creatures in there so tiny you cannot see them without a special magnifying device? In space, there are billions and billions of stars, and more beyond where humans have ever been or can see even with their special scientific inventions. Deep in the sea where it is totally dark, so far down no human could survive, creatures have been discovered that live down there, and they have shiny lights that go up and down their little bodies in different colors!

Whether big or small, the universe has wonders that the smartest scientists have not discovered. God is amazing!

Some people think that the world happened by accident or made itself over a long time. It is very important that you know that this is not true.

Why? One reason is that God deserves the glory for what He made. You would not like it if you worked to build or paint or cook something and everyone said it just happened by itself.

Another reason it is important to believe that God created everything is that you were not an accident and God does not want you to think so! God made you and loves you. Accidents usually do not have any value. But God gave you great value by creating you with a spirit and soul to know Him, and sending His own Son to die for you. This makes you very, very special.


ONE GOD IN THREE PERSONS

God wrote His Word, the Bible, to tell us about Himself. In the Old Testament, God teaches us many things.

Most of the Old Testament tells us about God the Father and how God takes care of the people who believe in Him. He rewards those who do right and punishes those who do wrong. In the next few lessons, we will go back to the Old Testament to study more about how God works and who He is.

“In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.” You probably remember that this is the first verse in the Bible.

But did you know that Jesus was with God in the beginning? The Bible says He was. The Bible says that Jesus created all things. He is eternal just like God the Father. He was there all the time in the Old Testament and the New Testament.



The Bible says Jesus is one with God and is God.

God's Holy Spirit was also there at the beginning.

Through the Old Testament, God's Spirit would come to give people power for certain jobs. In the New Testament and ever since, God's Spirit would come to live inside every person who accepts God's salvation through Jesus.

There is only one God, but God is in 3 Persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

God the Father and His Son and His Holy Spirit are One. God has all power. He can be God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit all at once.

People cannot do this, but God can do this because He is God. This is hard for us humans to understand, but the Bible says it, and we believe it by faith. Everything God says is perfectly true.

THINK ABOUT IT

There are many times in the Bible when Jesus said that He and God the Father are One. Jesus also talked about the Holy Spirit of God. That means there is God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. This is called the **Trinity**.

This does not mean that there are 3 different Gods. The Bible says over and over again that there is only one God.

It is hard to understand how Jesus could be with God and be God at the same time. It is hard to understand how God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit could be One and still be in different places doing different things.

This is a truth that is not easy to understand, but God is not a human. He can do and be things that are impossible for humans. We may never completely understand this until we get to heaven. But we can believe it by faith.

Remember what faith means? **Faith** is believing even when we cannot see something for ourselves. We have faith that God can do and be whatever He wants. We have faith that the Bible is perfectly true because it is God's Word. Everything God says is perfectly true.

GOD BLESSES OBEDIENCE AND FAITH

You have read stories about many people in the Bible. Remember the little boy who gave his lunch to Jesus and Jesus used it to feed 5,000 people? Remember the little girl who told Naaman's wife how Naaman could be healed of leprosy? God loves to use His people to do good work for Him.

Some people in the Bible obeyed God and were blessed by God. Other people did not obey God and were not blessed by God. Some people God could not use because they did not believe.

What kind of person does God use?

In Hebrews 11, God gives a list of people. They were different kinds of people



who liked to do different things. But one thing was the same about them.

They had faith.

All the people in this list had faith in God. They believed in God and believed that God would reward them if they tried to know God and do His will. Some of the people in this list are:

Abel – He offered the right sacrifice to God.

Noah – He built an ark that saved his family.

Abraham – He believed God's promise about Isaac.

Moses' parents – They kept baby Moses alive.

Moses – He gave up life in Pharaoh's house to suffer with his own people, and led them out of Egypt.

Joshua – He led his army around Jericho and defeated the city.

None of these people were just like any of the others. God honored each one, even though they were all different, because they had faith. God used each of them in a special way.

THINK ABOUT IT

God has a plan and a job for each person, but not every person lives God's good plan for them. Some people are too afraid. Some do not believe. Some choose Satan's plan instead.

But for every person who does have faith, God has a job for them to do for Him. He has different jobs for different people. God has a special plan for each person in His kingdom.

God has a special plan for you too! To do God's special plan, you will need to have faith and obey.

What kinds of things will you do? Only God knows! It is like a human body. Not every part does the same job. Your heart does not do what your legs do. Your eyes are not your ears. Each part has its own important job.

In 1 Corinthians 12, God says that the people who believe in Jesus as their Savior all make up one big body called the Body of Christ. This is not a physical body, but a spiritual body. All the believers working together are like Jesus' body here on earth. When we are kind, it is like being Jesus' hands for Him while He is in heaven. If we go to other places to tell about Jesus, it is like we are His feet.

If you are a believer in Jesus Christ, there is an important place in this great body for you. Have faith and obey, and God will use you to do great things for Him!


GIDEON FIGHTS A BATTLE FOR GOD

Israel disobeyed God again and again for many years, so God did not bless their nation like He wanted to. Enemies came and the Israelites had many hard times. The Israelites were afraid because one enemy, the Moabites, kept stealing from them and destroying their land.

The angel of the Lord came to a man named Gideon. Gideon was working in hiding because he was afraid of the Moabites.

The angel said, “The LORD is with you, you mighty man of valor.” He told Gideon that God would use him to fight the Moabites and win.

Gideon got an army together, but God said there were too many men. God wanted the glory for the victory. He did not want the Israelites to say they won because they were great soldiers.



He told Gideon to tell the men who were afraid to go home. There were 22,000 men who left. Only 10,000 men stayed.

God said that was still too many. When the army went down to the water for a drink, God told Gideon to find all the ones who got a drink with their faces bent down to the water. God told him to send those men home.

Gideon kept all the ones who used their hands to drink water. Only 300 men were left. What a small army!

Those 300 men went to fight the great Moabite army. Gideon gave them trumpets and jars and torches. That night they sneaked to the Moabites' tents. They surrounded them and shouted, "The sword of the LORD and of Gideon!" and broke their jars.

The noise scared the Moabites so much that they ran away! God had given Gideon a great victory.

SAMSON LOSES HIS STRENGTH


Before Samson was born, God told his parents that Samson would be special. He was to keep certain rules and be different from other people. God said this because He was going to use Samson to do great things. Samson was going to be the strongest man who ever lived.

The main rule Samson had to keep was to never cut his hair. Samson's hair was the sign of God's strength in him.

Samson grew up to be a very strong man. He fought against Israel's enemy, the Philistines. Once, Samson killed 1,000 Philistines with just the jawbone of a donkey. Another time, Samson carried away the gates of a city by himself!

Samson loved a woman named Delilah. She did not love God or serve God. Delilah made a deal with the Philistines to find out how Samson got so strong.

One day, Delilah asked Samson to tell her the secret of his great strength.



Samson told Delilah that if he was tied up with new ropes, he would not be strong. When Samson was sleeping, Delilah tied him up. But Samson broke free. Then he told her that if his hair was tied into a weaver's loom, he would not be strong. When he was sleeping, Delilah put his hair in a loom. Samson broke free again.

Delilah cried and said that Samson did not love her. Finally, after she had cried and cried, Samson told her that if his hair was cut he would not be strong.

That night, Delilah cut Samson's hair. The Philistines came, but Samson could not fight them. His strength was gone.

The Philistines poked out Samson's eyes and made him grind the grain like an animal.

One day, they had a party. They brought Samson in so they could laugh at him and praise their gods. They put Samson between the 2 biggest pillars of the building.

Samson's hair had grown again. He prayed and asked God for strength one more time. Samson pushed on the 2 pillars and they broke. The building fell down. Samson and many Philistines died.

You may be brave and strong and good. You may be able to play sports well or sing or cook. You may be very smart or talented. Satan will tempt you to be proud just like he tempted Samson. Samson did what Satan tempted him to do, and terrible things happened in his life.

When Satan tempts you to be proud, you can remember that it is God who lets you be good at the things you do well. God has given you these talents. It is God who gives us strength.

When Satan tempts you, do not be like Samson. Do not listen to his lies. Say no to Satan. Keep obeying God and trusting what God's Word says.

ground for the poor people. God had told them to do this so the poor would have food to eat. So, Ruth went out to gather grain for herself and Naomi.

GOD CHOOSES A NEW KING


The very first king of the Israelites was a man named Saul. Saul disobeyed God and God was not pleased. God said He would take away Saul's crown and give it to someone else.


God decided who would be the next king. He told a priest named Samuel to go out to the country to the house of a man named Jesse. God would show him who would be the next king.

Samuel went to Jesse's house. Jesse had 8 sons. Samuel told Jesse to bring his sons to him.

The first son came. His name was Eliab and he was big and strong. Samuel thought he must be the one God had chosen to be king.

But God told Samuel not to look at how tall and handsome





he was, because God does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks on the outside of a person, but the Lord looks at the inside, at a person's heart.

The next son came, and the next. Seven sons passed by Samuel, but God had not chosen any of them.

Samuel asked Jesse if he had any more sons. Jesse said he had one more named David. He was the youngest son. David was out in the fields watching the sheep. Samuel told Jesse to bring him.

David came to see Samuel. God told Samuel to get up and anoint him.

Samuel put oil on David's head. God had chosen David to be the next king.

But God reminded Samuel that the way someone looks is not what is most important. What is important is how they are on the inside. Young David was good and kind. He loved God with all his heart. He sang to God and praised God for His goodness. He wanted to learn more about God and serve Him.

This was the one God had chosen. God did not look for a person who looked like a king on the outside. God looked in people's hearts. He chose the one who would be a great king. He chose David because David loved God.

Even now, some people think that what a person looks like on the outside is most important. They think it matters what color skin a person has or how their faces look. It is important to them to have nice clothes or nice hair. They spend much time trying to make their outsides beautiful.

But God does not think the outside is as important as the inside. To be beautiful on the inside is so much more important than to be beautiful on the outside. A heart that loves God is truly beautiful. A person who loves God and serves God is a truly beautiful person to God.

From 1 Samuel 17

DAVID FIGHTS A GIANT

The Israelites were at war with the Philistines. David’s brothers had gone to fight, but David was too young to go. He stayed at home and watched the sheep.

One day, David’s father told him to go to the battle where his brothers were. He told David to take food to them and see how they were doing.

David obeyed and went to where the Israelites were fighting.

When he got there, no one was fighting. All the Israelites were afraid. A giant named Goliath came out. He was a Philistine. He was over 9 feet tall and had a huge spear and shield!

He yelled out against Israel. He said bad things about the one true God.

Goliath told the Israelites to send one man out to fight him.



If this man won, the Philistines would be servants to the Israelites. But if Goliath won, the Israelites would have to be slaves to the Philistines. No one in Israel wanted to fight this giant. All the soldiers were terrified!

David said that he would fight Goliath. He went to a brook and chose 5 smooth stones. He took his slingshot and went to fight Goliath.

Goliath saw David and he laughed. He said David was too small and he would kill him. But David said, “You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin. But I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts.” David told Goliath that he would defeat him and everybody there would know that the battle was the Lord’s.

David ran to Goliath. He swung his sling and a rock flew into the air. The rock hit Goliath on the forehead and the giant fell face down. David took Goliath’s big sword and used it to cut off the enemy’s head. Goliath was dead. David had won!

When the Philistines saw that their great Goliath was dead, they ran away. The Israelites chased them. God let a young boy kill the great giant. Soon God would make David the king of Israel.



When David heard Goliath say bad things about the one true God, David became angry. He would not let anyone say bad things about God. David knew God could help him win the battle against Goliath.

No one else had faith that God would help them. They were afraid of Goliath. They did not want to fight him. They did not want David to fight either. He was too young.

David was not afraid. He knew God was on his side. God would fight for him. God would not let His great name be shamed.

You are not too young to serve God either. If God is on your side, you should not be afraid. God is more powerful than any person. God always wins!

GOD ASKS SOLOMON A QUESTION

King David was getting older. Soon it would be time for a new king. God had chosen David's son, Solomon. When it was time for Solomon to be king, God came to him in a dream and said, "Ask! What shall I give you?"

Solomon answered God, "Now, O LORD my God, You have made Your servant king instead of my father David, but I am a little child ... And Your servant is in the midst of Your people whom You have chosen, a great people, too numerous to be numbered or counted. Therefore give to Your servant an understanding heart to judge Your people, that I may discern between good and evil. For who is able to judge this great people of Yours?"

God was pleased that Solomon had asked for an understanding heart



to judge the people well, instead of asking for long life, or riches, or power over his enemies. God told Solomon, “I have given you a wise and understanding heart, so that there has not been anyone like you before you.”

Because he chose well, God also said that he would give Solomon the things he did not ask for, “both riches and honor, so that there shall not be anyone like you among the kings all your days.”

God honored Solomon’s desire for wisdom because Solomon was not selfish. In all the world, before or since, there was never such a wise king as Solomon. People from all over the world came to hear his wisdom. He wrote 1,005 songs and spoke 3,000 proverbs.

Solomon built a glorious temple for God. His kingdom had peace all his life because God blessed him.

There are many times each day when you can be unselfish. You can help your mother and father. You can share with your brothers or sisters. You can do something nice for a friend or for a stranger. You can pray for other people.

SOLOMON MAKES A WISE CHOICE


Solomon became famous all over the world. Everyone knew of the great and wise king. People came to him for help. When someone had a problem, they could bring it to Solomon. He would tell them the wisest thing to do.

One day a very hard problem was brought to Solomon. Two women came to him. One was carrying a baby. One woman was very sad. She was crying. The other woman was angry.

The first woman started to tell her story. She told Solomon that she and the other woman lived in the same house.

One night, the other woman's baby died. While she was sleeping, the other woman switched the babies. When she woke up, the baby was dead!





But she looked at him and saw that it was not her son but the other woman's son.

The other woman said, "No! But the living one is my son, and the dead one is your son."

They argued in front of the king.

Solomon told his guard, "Bring me a sword."

His guard brought the sword. Solomon said, "Divide the living child in two, and give half to one, and half to the other."

One woman said, "Oh my lord, give her the living child, and by no means kill him!"

But the other said that cutting the child was fine. Then neither one of them would have a baby.

Solomon knew then who the real mother was. He had seen who loved the baby. He told the guard to give the baby to the woman who wanted to protect the baby. She was the baby's mother.

All over the kingdom, people heard about the great wisdom of Solomon. They knew that God was with him.

It is understanding the truth and knowing how to use the things we learn. True wisdom comes from God. Study God's Word. Read the Bible every day to learn God's wisdom. Then use that wisdom to bring joy to God. God's wisdom will help you solve problems. It will show you how to think and live. Whatever you are good at, God's wisdom will help you do those things even better.

And whatever you do, it should be pleasing to God. He is pleased when we serve Him with the good things He has given us. If you are good at music, you can use your musical abilities to praise God. If you are smart, you could help other people study the Bible. If you are a good helper, you can show God's love by helping other people.

Many kings ruled over Israel after Solomon. Most of them were bad kings. They did not love God.


The very worst king was King Ahab. He was an evil man. He married a wicked woman named Jezebel. Ahab and Jezebel did not worship God. They worshipped idols. Ahab built a temple and put an altar in it for an idol called Baal. Ahab worshipped other false gods also.

What King Ahab did made God angry with him.

There was a prophet in Israel named Elijah. He told the people God's words. Elijah went to see King Ahab. He told Ahab, "As the LORD God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, except at my word."

Ahab was very angry with Elijah and wanted to kill him.





God sent Elijah to a place called the Brook Cherith. God said Elijah could drink from the brook there, and God would tell the ravens to bring him food.

Elijah did what the Lord had said. He went to the Brook Cherith, and he stayed there until God told him to leave.

Each day, just as God had said, Elijah drank from the brook and the ravens brought him bread and meat.

All the time Elijah stayed there, he was never thirsty and never hungry. God took care of him.

You can also pray that God will help you to not be angry at them. Then you can forgive them, and you can show them about Jesus too.

Keep obeying God, and do not be afraid of angry people. God is more powerful than any person. If everyone in the whole world got together in one army, God would still be more powerful! He can protect you and give you what you need.

ELIJAH VISITS A WIDOW


Elijah, God's prophet, was staying near a stream because God had sent him there. It had not rained for a very long time. Finally, the stream dried up.

God told Elijah to go to a place called Zarephath and stay there. God said He told a widow there to give Elijah food.

Elijah obeyed God. He went to Zarephath. When he got there, he saw a widow picking up sticks. Elijah asked her to bring him some water and a piece of bread.

The widow told Elijah that she did not have any bread. She only had a handful of flour in a jar and a little bit of oil in a jug.

The lady was picking up a few sticks so she could go home



and make one meal for herself and her son. After that, they would die from hunger.

Elijah said, “Do not fear.” He told the widow to make a small cake of bread for him first, and then make bread for herself and her son. “For thus says the LORD God of Israel: ‘The bin of flour shall not be used up, nor shall the jar of oil run dry, until the day the LORD sends rain on the earth.’”

The widow believed what Elijah said. She went and did what he told her.

Every day, there was enough food for her, her son, and for Elijah. The flour was not used up and the oil did not run out, just as the Lord had said.

Even if you don’t feel like it, choose to obey God’s Word. What we feel changes a lot, but what we choose to do shows what we really believe.


ELIJAH GIVES THE PROPHETS OF BAAL A TEST

Wicked King Ahab hated God's prophet Elijah. He said Elijah made trouble for Israel.

But Elijah said it was Ahab who made trouble for Israel. Ahab had rejected God's commands and followed a false god named Baal. Elijah told Ahab to get all the people in Israel to come to a place called Mount Carmel. He told Ahab to bring the 450 prophets of Baal.

Elijah said that they would have a test. The prophets of Baal would offer a sacrifice to Baal. Elijah would offer a sacrifice to the Lord. The God that sent fire from heaven and burned the sacrifice would be the true God.

The prophets of Baal put their sacrifice on the altar. They cried out to



Baal to answer them. They danced and prayed, “O Baal, hear us!” But no one answered.

They shouted and prayed from morning until noon. They even cut themselves with swords and spears. But nothing happened.

Then it was Elijah’s turn. He put his sacrifice on the altar. Then he dug a ditch around the altar. He had men pour 4 big jars of water over the sacrifice. He told them to do it 3 times. There was so much water, it filled up the ditch.

Then Elijah prayed. He asked God to prove to the people that the Lord was the one true God.

The fire of the Lord fell from heaven. It burned up the sacrifice. It burned the altar, the ground, and even burned up all the water in the ditch!

When the people saw this, they fell to the ground. They cried, “The LORD, He is God! The LORD, He is God!”

Elijah had all the prophets of Baal killed.

The people began to worship the one true God. After many months with no rain, God sent rain for their land again.

Idols are statues made of wood or stone, or pictures on the wall that people worship. People pray to these statues. They bow to these statues or pictures and worship them.

If you took some wood and built a house with your own hands, would you worship the house and ask it to answer your prayers? No. Would you bow to wood you burned in the fire? Never. But an idol could have been made from the same wood that you made a house with. A statue could be made out of the firewood you did not use.

Can statues or idols talk? No! They are made of stone or wood. They cannot talk.

Can they hear? Can they see? Can they touch things? No, no, no! Everyone knows they cannot.

Can they answer people’s prayers if they cannot hear? Can they help protect people if they cannot move? Do the statues and pictures love the people who worship them?

Statues or pictures cannot answer people’s prayers or help the people who worship them. They can be knocked over or cut apart or destroyed. They cannot help people. They cannot even help themselves.

People make idols. It is wrong to worship anything people make instead of the great God who created all things.

Only God can hear prayers. Only God can help us. Only God deserves to be worshipped.


A WIDOW NEEDS GOD'S HELP



You can pray when you have big problems or little problems. You can talk to God when you are happy or sad, afraid or alone. God wants you to talk to Him wherever you are and whatever is happening in your life. God wants you to live like he is always there with you, because He is! He is a heavenly Father who is always there to listen and help His children. He wants you to tell Him everything. What a wonderful God!

NAAMAN HAS LEPROSY

Soldiers from a place called Aram fought against Israel. They took some Israelites away and made them slaves. One little girl was sent to serve a woman whose husband was named Naaman.

Naaman was a mighty soldier. He was the leader of the army of Aram. But Naaman had a terrible disease called leprosy.

One day, the little girl told Naaman's wife that if Naaman could see the prophet in Israel, he could be cured of his leprosy.

The wife told Naaman and Naaman went to see the prophet Elisha. Naaman came with horses and chariots and servants.

When he got to Elisha's house, Elisha sent his servant to the door. The servant gave the message that Naaman



should go and wash in the Jordan River 7 times. Then he would be healed.

Naaman was angry. The muddy Jordan River? He wanted the prophet to come and stand before him, call to God, and heal him. But one of Naaman's servants was wise. He told Naaman, "If the prophet had told you to do something great, would you not have done it? How much more then, when he says to you, 'Wash, and be clean'?"

People watch what you do. They listen to how you talk. When people see what you do and hear what you say, does it make them want to learn more about God? Your kindness and good works could help people know that there is only one true God.

It is very sad when people worship idols instead of God. The idols cannot speak or hear or see or touch. God sees us always. He hears our prayers and answers them. He created us and knows everything about us. He speaks to us through His Word, the Bible. What a wonderful God He is!

People can love a piece of stone, or a piece of wood, but it cannot love them back. It does not care about them or want to make sure they have what they need. But God cares about His children and promises to provide what they need. God loves people very much. God loves you.

You may love God very much right now. But you may ask, "How do I keep from forgetting about God or turning away from God?"

God wants us to have a relationship with Him. He wants us to know Him. That is why it is so important to spend time with God each day. When we read the Bible, we learn more about God. When we pray, we are spending time with Him.

But the queen said she would not come. The king was so angry, he sent her away. She could never come back.


Then the king wanted a new queen. He sent his servants out to bring all the unmarried girls who were pretty. The servants took the girls and brought them to the king's palace.

There will be times when you are afraid to do what you know is right. Pray before you do the right thing. Ask other people to pray for you. Ask God to help you do what is right.

If you are not sure what the right thing to do is, study God's Word. If you know something is right to do, pray, then do what is right with God's strength. God will help you. Remember Philippians 4:13: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

JOB TRUSTS IN GOD


There was a man named Job. Job loved God and did what was right.




THREE YOUNG MEN OBEY GOD

Many of the Israelites had been taken away to live in a land called Babylon. The king of Babylon built a huge statue of himself. It was made of gold.

The king called many people to come see the statue. The king made a law that when the music started, everyone had to bow down and worship this statue. Anyone who did not worship it would be thrown into a hot, hot furnace of fire!

The music started. Everyone bowed to the statue. But 3 young men were still standing up! Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were Israelites. They did not worship the idol.

When the king found out, he was very angry. He brought the 3 young men to him. He told them if they did not worship the statue, he would throw them into the fire!



The 3 young men said, “Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us from your hand, O king. But if not, let it be known to you, O king, that we do not serve your gods, nor will we worship the gold image which you have set up.”

The king was so angry, he made the fire 7 times hotter than before. He had his servants tie up the 3 young men and throw them in. The fire was so hot that the servants who threw them in died.

The king sat down to watch. Then he jumped to his feet. The king was amazed. He could not believe it. He saw Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego walking around in the fire! And there was a fourth person with them in the fire.

The king called to them and the 3 young men came out. They were not hurt. Their clothes were not burned. They did not even smell like smoke!

The king knew then that the one true God had protected Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. He praised God.

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego believed that God could save them from the fire. They knew that God could do anything, but they said they would obey God even if the king killed them.

God did not stop the young men from being thrown into the fire, but He kept it from hurting them. God was with them in the fire. And God showed the king that He was the one true and only God and He has all power.

Because He is the one true God, He is the only One who should be worshiped. He created all things. Is it better to worship the Creator or something He created? The Creator is greater than the things He creates.

It is God’s power that created all people and all things. No man is greater than the God who made him. So we should never worship any person on earth. No animal is greater, so we should never worship animals. No idol or statue is greater than the God who made the trees and the stone the idol came from, so we should never worship idols or statues either. The only One worth worshiping is God. He is the King of kings. He is the one true God.


DANIEL WILL NOT PRAY TO THE KING

A man named Daniel lived in Babylon and worked for the king. Daniel loved God and worshiped God. He prayed to God every day.

Some wicked men hated Daniel. They wanted his high position with the king. They tried to catch Daniel doing wrong so they could tell the king.

But they could never find Daniel doing wrong because Daniel obeyed God's laws and did what was right.

The wicked men made a plan. They knew Daniel worshiped God. They went to the king and told the king he should make a new law. The law was that no one could pray to anyone except the king. If anyone did, that person would be thrown into a den of lions.



Daniel heard about the new law. He went home and prayed to God just like he did every day.

The wicked men saw him and told the king. The king was sad because he liked Daniel. He did not want to throw him to the lions. The king wanted to change the law, but he could not.

They threw Daniel into the den of lions.

The king worried all night. He did not eat or sleep.

Early in the morning, the king rushed to the den of lions. He called to Daniel, "Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve continually, been able to deliver you from the lions?"

And Daniel answered! He was still alive! Daniel told the king, "My God sent His angel and shut the lions' mouths, so that they have not hurt me."

The king made a new law that everyone had to worship Daniel's God. Daniel's God was the one true God.

The wicked, jealous men who tricked the king were thrown into the den of lions. The hungry lions ate them up.

Daniel would not obey the king's law. The king's law disobeyed God's law. God's law is more important than any law any person can make. Daniel would not obey any law against the one true God. He chose to obey God.

Daniel worshiped and prayed to God just as God's law said to do. He worshiped only God, not a man or idol. He would not pray to the king. He would not even pretend to pray to the king, or pray to God in secret, so he could stay safe.

It took faith to make that decision. Daniel kept obeying God, trusting God to take care of him. And God did!

God wants us to obey the people who rule over us. He said so in His Word. But if those people want us to disobey God, we should not obey them. Obey God always, no matter what. Keep doing what is right, trusting God to take care of you.

It might seem that a ruler or person with power has control of your situation, but they really do not. God is the Most High Ruler over all. He is over every human and can protect and guard His children.


JONAH RUNS AWAY FROM GOD



NICODEMUS COMES TO SEE JESUS





One day, Jesus told His disciples, "Let us cross over to the other side." They left the crowd and got into a boat. They started sailing the boat to the other side.


Suddenly, a terrible storm came.


JESUS TALKS TO A SAMARITAN WOMAN

Jesus was walking through Samaria. He was tired so He stopped at a well. A woman came to the well to get water. When she got to the well, Jesus asked her to give Him a drink.

The woman was surprised. Jesus was a Jew and the Jews did not talk to Samaritans. They did not like each other.

But Jesus said, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."

The woman did not understand.



Jesus did not have a bucket to get water. How could He give her water?

Jesus told her that when she drank the water from this well, she would get thirsty again. But the water God wanted to give her was special. If she drank it, she would never be thirsty again. The woman was excited. She asked Jesus to give her this special water.

She wanted physical water, but Jesus was talking about spiritual water.

Jesus talked more with the woman. She was surprised that Jesus knew so many things about her. How could He know these things? He knew because He is God's Son and God knows everything.

The woman ran into town and told people about the Man at the well. Many people came to listen to Jesus. He stayed for 2 days telling them about the kingdom of God. He told them about God's plan of salvation. Many people believed in Jesus. They told the woman, "Now we believe, not because of what you said, for we ourselves have heard Him and we know that this is indeed the Christ, the Savior of the world."

THINK ABOUT IT

When you play hard in the hot sun, you get thirsty. You want water. So, you get some water and take a big drink. But what happens when you go back outside to play? Soon you need more water. No matter how much you drink today, you will need more tomorrow.

Jesus told the woman at the well that He could give her special water that would last forever. But Jesus did not mean earthly water that we can put in a container and drink. He meant spiritual water.

Every person wants to know about God. People want to know who made the trees, flowers, birds, and animals. People want to know what will happen when they die. People want to know if there is a God who loves them.

Wanting to know about God is like being spiritually thirsty. When we believe the truth about God and His Son, Jesus, it will be enough. We will KNOW who made everything. We will KNOW what will happen when we die. We will KNOW that God loves us. We will KNOW God.

When God comes to live inside a person, he or she gets filled up with Him, and it is like never being thirsty again. This is what Jesus meant when He told the woman about God's special water. Everyone needs this special water. Everyone needs God.




WHAT CAN WE LEARN FROM SHEEP?

Remember David in the Old Testament, the shepherd boy who became a great king? David wrote many poems and songs in the book of Psalms. He wrote in Psalm 23, "The LORD is my shepherd."

Jesus called Himself the Good Shepherd. Jesus taught about how He takes care of His sheep. He said a shepherd knows his sheep, and the sheep know the shepherd's voice.

We are like sheep. Jesus is the Good Shepherd, and we are His sheep.

Jesus said this to teach us. Sheep should always follow their shepherd. We should always follow Jesus.



The shepherd protects the sheep from wolves and thieves. Jesus protects us from Satan and evil.

The shepherd shows the sheep the best way to go. Jesus teaches us the best way to live. He teaches us in the Bible.

If a sheep goes the wrong way, the shepherd goes and finds it and brings it back. When we do wrong, Jesus' Holy Spirit **convicts** us in our hearts - makes us feel bad for doing wrong - to turn and come back to Him.

Sheep should stay close to the shepherd. We should stay close to Jesus. We do that by praying and reading God's Word and obeying His commands.

The sheep should listen and obey the shepherd's voice. When we read God's Word, we should obey what Jesus tells us to do.

A good shepherd loves his sheep so much, he would die to protect them. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, died for us so we could have life forever in heaven.

A PHARISEE AND A TAX COLLECTOR PRAY


The Pharisees were religious leaders who loved to say loud prayers so everyone could hear them. They did good things so everyone could see them. They wanted everyone to know how good they were.

Jesus went to a city called Jericho. He started walking through the city.


There was a man in Jericho named Zacchaeus. He took taxes from people for the government. He also took extra money for himself. He was very rich.

One day, the scribes and Pharisees tried to test Jesus. They brought a woman to Him. She had sinned and been caught. She was guilty. They told Jesus that in the law, Moses said she must die. They should throw stones at her until she died. They asked Jesus what He thought they should do.

Jesus did not say anything. He bent down and wrote in the dirt with His finger. The Pharisees kept asking Him. Finally, Jesus stood up and said, "He who is without sin among you, let him throw a stone at her first."

One by one, feeling guilty in their own hearts, the men left. Jesus looked around and said, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?"

The woman said, "No one, Lord."

Jesus told the woman, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."

The scribes and Pharisees thought that Jesus was trying to take away the law of Moses in the Old Testament by teaching people to love and show mercy.

But Jesus told them that the law was to show people that they could never be good enough to earn salvation. It was to show them they needed God's mercy. Once, Jesus told the Pharisees, "You search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which testify of Me. But you are not willing to come to Me that you may have life" (John 5:39-40).

The Pharisees thought they did not need mercy like this woman did. But Jesus wanted them to see that all people need mercy. That is why Jesus did not tell the men to kill the woman who had sinned. Jesus wanted them to understand that all of them had sinned. All of them should be punished like the woman.

Jesus had mercy on her and forgave her sin. Yes, the woman had done wrong. But so have we. We are all sinners. We all need mercy.

Some people think there are big sins and little sins. They think little sins do not matter as much as the big sins.

But God hates all sin. The Pharisees were as bad as the woman was. We are too. All people have sinned. But Jesus came to take the punishment for our sins. Any person can come to Jesus for forgiveness and mercy. Even the woman. Even the Pharisees. Even us!

Jesus had finished teaching the people. He had done a great miracle by feeding 5,000 people with just 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish.


Jesus told His disciples to get in a boat and go to the other side of the lake. But Jesus did not go with them. He went somewhere by Himself and prayed to God His Father.

The Bible says that living the Christian life is like running a race in a contest. We need faith and courage to run this race and finish well. Hebrews 12:1-2 says, "Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares [traps] us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith."

We are to set aside all the things that would keep us from running the race well. These are things in your life that keep you from doing what God wants. They may be worry, or fear, or things we like to do that take up all our time. We should make sure God is most important in our lives as we run this race. And while we run, we should keep our eyes on Jesus. When we are looking to Him and trusting in Him, we have faith, and we will finish well.






JESUS LOVES CHILDREN!


A SON LEAVES HOME

LAZARUS DIES


Jesus had a very good friend named Lazarus. Lazarus had 2 sisters, Mary and Martha. Jesus visited and stayed with them many times.

If He leaves the problem in your life, you can still trust Him. Then people will see that you have faith in God. They will see that you believe God is with you even in bad times. Maybe because of the sad times you have had, someone will believe in Jesus. They will see your trust in God and want to learn more about Him.

JESUS TEACHES HIS DISCIPLES TO SERVE

Jesus and His disciples were almost ready to celebrate a special feast called the Passover. Jesus knew it would soon be time for Him to die as God's perfect sacrifice for all people. He spent much time teaching His 12 disciples. That night, He taught them a lesson about how to love and serve each other.

Jesus was sitting at the feast with His disciples. Then He got up and put a towel around His waist. He put water into a bowl and started washing the disciples' feet. He dried their feet with a towel.



When Jesus had washed all the disciples' feet, He sat down again.

Then Jesus said, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you."

Jesus told His disciples that a servant is not greater than his master. He told them that if they knew these things, and did what Jesus their Master did, then they would be happy.

THINK ABOUT IT

The disciples all wanted to be great men. Sometimes they even argued about who would be the greatest one in God's kingdom. Jesus knew that they were thinking of themselves first and not of others.

When He washed their feet, the disciples were very surprised. Jesus was acting like a servant! Everyone knew that it was the servant who serves the master. The master does not serve the servant. Jesus was the master and the disciples followed Him. They should serve Him. But Jesus washed their feet, something a servant would do. Why did He do this?

Jesus did this to teach them. He wanted them to know that great people are the ones who serve others.

When you think of yourself first and not others, you are serving yourself. When you think of others first, then you are serving God. You are doing what God wants.

Jesus is the Master. We serve Him. If we love Him, then we obey Him. Jesus washed the disciples' feet. If Jesus would humble Himself to serve His followers, we should humble ourselves to serve others. When we do this, we are being like Jesus. This makes God very happy.



JESUS EATS THE PASSOVER FEAST

The night came for the Passover feast. The Israelites had this feast on the same night every year since God delivered His people from slavery in Egypt. After 9 terrible plagues, the 10th plague was going to be that the oldest son in every family would die on a certain night. God saved the Israelites' oldest sons from death because they obeyed God and sacrificed a lamb and put the blood on their door frames. Then God delivered the Israelites from Egypt.

But this Passover night was very special. Jesus knew it would be the last time He celebrated the Passover feast with His disciples.



He had something very important to tell them.

Jesus took the bread and He broke it. He gave the bread to His disciples and said, “This is My body which is given for you.” He told them to remember Him when they broke the Passover bread.

Then Jesus took the cup. The drink represented the blood that He would shed for them. He told them to remember Him when they drank it.

The disciples did not understand that Jesus was going to die, but Jesus knew. He gave them the bread and told them that His body would be broken. He gave them the drink and said His blood would be shed. He knew they would understand later.

The Passover was a picture of a heavenly truth. Whoever had the blood of a lamb on their door frames was saved from death. God saved everyone who obeyed and delivered them from slavery to Egypt.

God used the Passover to show that one day a Savior would come to save people from eternal death and their slavery to sin.

All lost people are slaves to sin. Have you ever wanted to do right, but you did wrong instead? Have you tried to do right, but still sinned? Satan wants sin to control you. He wants you to stay a slave to sin.

We are all sinners. We cannot be free from sin without God’s help.

But God made a way to set people free from sin! He sent a Savior. Jesus is that Savior. He told the disciples His body would be broken and His blood shed as the one perfect sacrifice. Jesus used the bread and drink as a new picture. It would remind us that Jesus died to pay the price for sin so we could be free.

We do not sacrifice lambs for our sins anymore because the lambs were just a picture of Jesus until He came. Jesus was the perfect sacrifice. He had to die so we could be saved. Anyone who accepts Jesus’ payment for their sins is saved. Anyone who is saved is free from the control of sin. Yes, sometimes we still do wrong, but we are not slaves to sin and Satan’s power anymore. Instead, we can be controlled by God’s Holy Spirit, who helps us do what is good and right.

Jesus sets us free!

JESUS IS ARRESTED


Jesus and His disciples had eaten the Passover feast. They were sitting and talking. Jesus told them that they would all run away from Him soon.

Peter told Jesus that he would never leave Him. Peter said he would even die for Jesus.

Jesus told Peter that before the rooster crowed, Peter would deny Jesus 3 times.

But Peter and the other disciples told Jesus that they would never leave Him or turn away from Him.

When they left the feast, Jesus went up on the Mount of Olives to pray. He prayed to God His Father for a long time. When He finished



praying, Jesus and the disciples saw a crowd of people coming. They had swords and clubs in their hands. The men arrested Jesus. All the disciples ran away and hid!

The men took Jesus to the high priest. They lied about Him and made fun of Him. They hit Jesus.

Peter had come back and was sitting outside the building. A servant girl came to him and said, "This man was also with Him."

Peter said, "Woman, I do not know Him."

Someone else looked at Peter and said, "You also are of them."

Peter was afraid. He said, "Man, I am not!"

Another person said Peter was one of Jesus' disciples.

Peter was very afraid. He shouted, "Man, I do not know what you are saying!" Just then a rooster crowed. Jesus turned and looked right at Peter. Peter had done what Jesus said he would do. Three times he said he did not know Jesus.

Peter was so sad that he went outside and cried and cried.

And Jesus forgave Peter.

JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS


The governor did not want to kill Jesus. He told the people that Jesus had not done anything wrong. He should not die. But the people would not listen. They wanted Jesus killed. Finally, the governor gave Jesus to them.

The soldiers laughed and called Jesus a king. They put a crown on his head made out of thorns. They beat Jesus many times.

The soldiers put 2 pieces of wood together in the shape of a cross. They nailed Jesus' hands and feet to the cross and hung Him there. He was in terrible pain and bleeding badly.

But Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

Two men were being killed at the same time as Jesus. They were thieves. One thief yelled at Jesus. "If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us."



But the other thief told him that they deserved to be punished, but Jesus had done nothing wrong.

Then this thief said to Jesus, “Lord, remember me when You come into Your kingdom.”

Jesus promised the man, “Today you will be with Me in Paradise.”

It was daytime but suddenly the sky became dark. It was so dark, no one could see. It stayed dark for 3 hours. Jesus said, “It is finished!” Then He died.

When the soldiers were sure Jesus was dead, they let His friends come and put Him in a tomb.

All those who had believed in Him were very sad. The disciples ran away when Jesus was arrested. Now they hid. They were afraid. What would happen now that Jesus was dead?

It would have been easy for Jesus to do these things. It took more courage to stay on the cross and follow God’s plan. (See Matthew 26:52-54.)

Jesus knew God’s plan. People could not be saved without a Savior. God’s plan was for Jesus to die to pay the price for sin. So, Jesus stayed on the cross by His own choice and let them kill Him.

One thief believed that Jesus was God’s Son. Jesus forgave that man’s sins. He promised the thief that he would go to heaven when he died.

Jesus will do the same for you if you ask Him.


JESUS ROSE FROM THE DEAD!

Later, Jesus came to see the disciples. They were so very joyful that Jesus was alive.



But one disciple named Thomas

was not there when Jesus came. The disciples told Thomas that they had seen Jesus. He was alive! But Thomas did not believe them. Thomas said he would not believe unless he saw the nail holes in Jesus' hands and could touch Jesus' side where the soldier's spear had pierced Him.

One week later, all the disciples were together. Thomas was there too. The doors were shut and locked, but Jesus came in and stood with them. He said, "Peace to you!" Then Jesus spoke to Thomas. He told Thomas to look at the nail holes in His hands. He told Thomas to touch His side where He had been pierced. Jesus said to stop doubting and believe.

Thomas said, "My Lord and my God!"

Then Jesus told Thomas, "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Some people say there is no God. They say that they cannot see God with their eyes, so He must not be there. Those people are like Thomas. Thomas did not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. He did not believe until He saw Jesus with his own eyes.

Jesus wanted Thomas to have faith. He wanted Thomas to believe even when he could not see with his eyes. Jesus said the people who believe when they have not seen are blessed.

You have never seen God with your eyes. How do you know He is there? How do you know He cares about you? How do you know that Jesus died for you and rose from the dead? It takes faith.

Do you believe that there are other villages and cities far away from yours? Do you believe the world is big and there are other countries with different people living there? Why do you believe these things? You have not been everywhere to see them all in person. But you believe because someone told you, or you read about it, or saw pictures, and you believed that those things were true.

Faith is like this. When you have faith, you believe even when you have not seen. You believe in God because of the Bible. You believe what the Bible says about Jesus. Faith is believing that what God says is perfectly true.

We should not believe everything, but should believe only what is true. If people tell you something you are not sure about, check and find out if what they are saying is true. When people tell you things about God or Jesus, you can always check what the Bible says. The Bible is God's perfect truth.

GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION IS FOR YOU

God knew that people could never do anything good enough to earn eternal life with Him. Nothing people can do will take away their sins. No matter how many good things people do, they are still sinners.

God wants all people to live in heaven with Him. But God is perfectly holy, and heaven is a place with no sin. Something had to happen to take away people's sins and make them clean.

In the Old Testament, God told people that when they sinned, they could sacrifice a lamb with no spots or imperfections. They would be forgiven if they obeyed. The little lamb could not



take away their sins. The sacrifice was an earthly picture of a spiritual truth. It was a reminder of God's promise that one day He would send His perfect sacrifice, the Savior, to pay the price for all sin. People in the Old Testament had to have faith that God would send the Savior He promised.

God did send the promised Savior. He is God's only Son. Because He is perfect, He is the only One Who could be the holy sacrifice to take away sins.

His name is Jesus. He left heaven and came to earth. He lived on earth for 33 years. Jesus never sinned, not even once. John called him "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).

When it was time for God's plan of salvation to be complete, Jesus died on a cross and rose again. Jesus gave Himself to be the perfect sacrifice and take away the sins of all who believe in Him. He is the perfect Lamb of God.

God talks about lambs many times in His Word.

Adam's son, Abel, sacrificed a lamb to God. God was pleased with this.

On the Passover night in Egypt, the Israelites were told to sacrifice a lamb. The angel of death passed over the families who obeyed.

Before Jesus came, people who sinned had to make a sacrifice to be forgiven of their sins. Many, many lambs were sacrificed. These lambs could not really take away sins. They were a picture of the perfect Lamb who would come.

Then, in God's time, the perfect Lamb of God came. He died so our sins could be taken away. He gave Himself as the perfect sacrifice for us.

We cannot be saved by doing good things. We can only be saved by believing that Jesus died to pay for our sins. Jesus is God's perfect Lamb. The Bible says in Romans 10:9, "That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."


JESUS GOES BACK TO HEAVEN

Many people saw Jesus after He rose from the dead. He visited the disciples and taught them. One time, a crowd of 500 people saw Him.

Jesus told the disciples that God's Holy Spirit would come to them. He had talked about God's Holy Spirit before. Jesus had said that when He left, He would not leave them alone. The Holy Spirit of God would be with them.

The Spirit of God would live inside every person who believed in Jesus. This Holy Spirit helps the believer to know what is right and what is wrong.

For 40 days, Jesus taught people about God's plan of salvation and God's heavenly kingdom.



Then one day, Jesus finished His teaching on earth. He told the disciples to go to places near and far away to tell people about God's plan of salvation. They should tell people how God sent His Son to earth to die for their sins. They should tell them that if they accept Jesus' payment for their sins, then Jesus would forgive them and they would live forever in heaven.

When Jesus finished talking, He went back up to heaven. The disciples watched Jesus go up until they could not see Him anymore.

Two men dressed in white spoke to them. They said, "Why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven."

The disciples obeyed Jesus. God's Holy Spirit came to them. They went many places telling people how they could be saved from sin and live forever in heaven with Jesus.

In heaven, Jesus will be the Judge. He will separate all the people. The ones who did not believe in Jesus must go to hell. All the people who have accepted Jesus' payment for their sins will go to live forever in heaven.

What should we be doing until Jesus comes back? We should be busy obeying Him, so when He comes He will find us serving Him. We should keep studying our Bible every day and doing what it says. We should keep praying. And we should share the good news of Jesus with others who do not know Him as their Savior.


STEPHEN DIES FOR JESUS


The people who loved Jesus spent time together praising God and learning about God. They went many places to tell other people about God's plan of salvation. Many people accepted Jesus' gift of eternal life in heaven.

One believer was named Stephen. Stephen loved Jesus very much. He told many people about Jesus. He did many wonderful things to serve his Savior.

But the same religious leaders who had hated Jesus hated Stephen too. They tried to argue with him, but Stephen was wise and spoke the truth. They could not win when they argued with Stephen!

So, the religious leaders told people to lie about Stephen.





They said that Stephen had been saying bad things about Moses and about God.

People became angry. They took Stephen to a trial. At the trial, Stephen did not tell them what a good person he was. He told the people all about God's plan of salvation. He told them about God's promises in the Old Testament. He told them about Jesus. He told them that Jesus was the Savior who God promised would come.

Stephen looked up. He said "Look! I see the heavens opened." He said he saw Jesus right next to God. The religious leaders were so angry that they took Stephen out and they threw rocks at him.

Stephen did not fight back. He prayed and forgave the men.

Stephen died that day for Jesus.

Stephen is not the only person who ever died for Jesus. Since that time, many, many people have suffered because they believed in Jesus. Some have been killed by angry people. You may know someone who people have hated or been mean to because that person believes in Jesus. Maybe people have been unkind to you because Jesus is your Savior.

God's Word says that we should love our enemies. He says we should bless the people who curse us and do good to the people who hate us. Jesus says we should pray for the people who do bad things to us.

Stephen obeyed Jesus. He loved his enemies. He prayed for them and he forgave them. God gave him the strength to do this.

When you suffer or you think of people suffering, remember Jesus. Think of how much Jesus suffered for us. He did so much for us, we should be willing to go through suffering for Him.

God will give you the strength to love your enemies too. Ask Him for help.




SAUL SEES A LIGHT FROM HEAVEN

Saul hated the people who worshiped Jesus. He searched all around to find them. When he found them, he put them in jail and did other bad things to them.

One day, Saul decided to go to a place called Damascus. He was going there to find people who worshiped Jesus. He was going to put them in jail.

While Saul and a few men were traveling



to Damascus, a light from heaven suddenly came down all around them. Saul fell to the ground.

Then a voice said, “Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?”

“Who are You, Lord?” Saul asked.

“I am Jesus,” the voice said. Jesus told Saul to go to the city, and then he would be told what to do.

Saul got up, but he could not see. The other men had to help him get to Damascus.

Many people prayed to God for Peter.

Peter was in jail that night. He was sleeping between 2 soldiers. He had chains holding him. More guards were at the door.

Suddenly, an angel of the Lord came. The angel woke Peter up and said, "Arise quickly!" The chains fell off and Peter could stand up. The angel told Peter to put his clothes and sandals on. Then the angel said, "Follow me."



They walked right out of the prison. No one stopped them or saw them. Peter did not think it was really happening. He thought it was a dream.

They got to the gate and the gate opened by itself. After they walked through the gate and down the street, the angel left.

Then Peter knew that God had set him free from the jail. He went to the house of one of his friends. Many people had come together at that house to pray for Peter.

He knows what is best for you. You can trust Him to do what is best.

This was so unusual that all the other prisoners listened. They wanted to hear what Paul and Silas were singing about. Why were they praying? Why were they praising God? How could they be so happy in jail?

Then, when the earthquake came, the jailer wanted to know how he could be saved. He could see that Paul and Silas were different. He wanted the faith they had.

When bad things happen to you, remember Paul and Silas. Pray to God and praise Him. Then other people may want to know how you can be so happy. They may ask how they can be saved. Then you can tell them how much God loves them.

The way you act is very important. If you are one of God’s children, people watch you. They will see if you are different from other people. They will watch how you act when bad things happen. Even if you are not talking about Jesus, the things you do and say should show that you belong to God and are following His way. Your peace and love and joy will make other people want to know more about God.


PAUL IS IN A SHIPWRECK

They put Paul on a ship with other prisoners. It was not a good time to sail. Paul told the men that they should not sail because it was not safe. But the men did not listen to Paul. They put him and the other prisoners on the boat. Then they started to sail to Rome.

A very fast and dangerous wind came. Then a storm started. The ship was pushed by the wind and the waves. The men threw ropes around the ship to hold it together.

Days went by but the storm would not stop. The men threw everything they could into the sea.



The storm kept going for 14 days. The men had not eaten for a long time. They were worried and afraid. But Paul told them that an angel of God had told him they should eat. Not one of them would die if they obeyed. They were glad to hear this and ate some food.

The ship got stuck close to land, and all the people swam to shore. Not one of them died. They were on an island called Malta.

The people there built a fire for them because it was cold. Paul was throwing some wood on the fire when a poisonous snake bit Paul's hand!

But Paul just shook the snake off. All the people waited for Paul to swell up or fall down dead. But nothing happened. After that, the people listened to Paul. They knew he was a special man. Paul told them he had a special God!

When they all finally got to Rome, Paul lived in a house as a prisoner. People came to visit him. He told the people who came about Jesus.

But then Paul shook the snake off and nothing happened. He did not get sick. He did not die. Then the people decided that Paul must be a god.

Paul was not a god. He did not have any special power by himself. He told the people that it was the one true God who protected Paul. It was God's power that kept Paul from dying. God did this to show His power.

People like to talk about other people and make guesses that are often not true. When the snake bit Paul, they said God was judging him. Maybe something bad has happened to you and people are saying God is judging you. If you have sinned, confess your sin to God. But if you are clean and doing God's will, do not worry about what people say. They do not know everything.

A few minutes later, when Paul did not die, the people decided he was a god! They stopped saying bad things about him and started to worship him instead. Maybe God has done some wonderful things in someone's life and now people think that person has special powers. Do not let yourself follow anything people say. Test to see if what they are saying is true. For this situation, the truth is that we should give glory to God, not to men.

People change. They may say bad things one minute and good things the next minute. Do not spend your time worrying about what people say or think. Make sure you are following God's way, and let God take care of the rest.


GOD WANTS EVERYONE TO KNOW THE GOOD NEWS



THE BIBLE IS MY LAMP

You have finished all the lessons and learned so many things. You learned about people who believed and obeyed God and were blessed. You also learned about people who did not believe or obey and were punished.

Which do you think is a happier life, to obey and be blessed or to disobey and be punished? To obey, of course!

Satan wants you to think that evil is fun and exciting, and if you do good you will be bored or unhappy. Remember that Satan is a liar. In John 8:44, Jesus said Satan was the father of lying.

You will have many decisions to make in your future. You will decide what kind of people will be your friends. You will decide what movies to watch and books to read. You will decide how you will act toward your parents and teachers.

The decisions you make become your life. It is like a path you make for yourself.



Some paths lead to a life of happiness and blessings. Some paths lead to sin and shame and sadness.

How can you know what path is good and what path is bad? If your life path is made by your choices, how can you know which choices are good and which are bad?

In the book of Psalms, David says God's Word is a lamp for his feet and a light for his path. As we walk the path of life, we need to know where to go. If we do not have light, we will stumble and fall. If we do not have light to guide us, we may go the wrong way.

God's Word is a lamp to guide us on the path of life. When we read God's Word, God shows us which way to go. He shows us things we should stay away from because they are bad for us. He lights up the good path so we can follow His ways.

Each day for the rest of your life, use God's Word as a lamp to light your way. Turn away from each choice that leads to Satan's dark path of sin. Choose God's path of light and life and joy!

THINK ABOUT IT

If a person is lost in a dark jungle with no light, how will that person be able to find the right way to go? He may feel around with his hands, but without light he may choose the wrong way. He could start walking, but without light he will not see dangerous things, like holes he may fall into, or wild animals, or a cliff edge he might fall off! Not having light is a scary thing. Darkness keeps you from knowing the way to go.

But a person who has light can see which way to go. He does not run into trees or fall into holes or off a cliff because he can see those things and stay away from them on the path. He does not need to be afraid because he knows he is walking on the right path.

Sin is called darkness in the Bible. Sin is dangerous and deadly. Walking in darkness, in Satan's way, will keep you from following the right path.

But 1 John 1:5 says that God is light, and John 1:9 says Jesus is the Light of the world. When we follow God's Holy Word, we are living in God's light. We know the way to go. We follow the good path. We do not need to be afraid of darkness, because we have the Light. Read God's Word each day all your life and follow the path God shows you. You will always be on the right path when you live by the light of God's Word.
