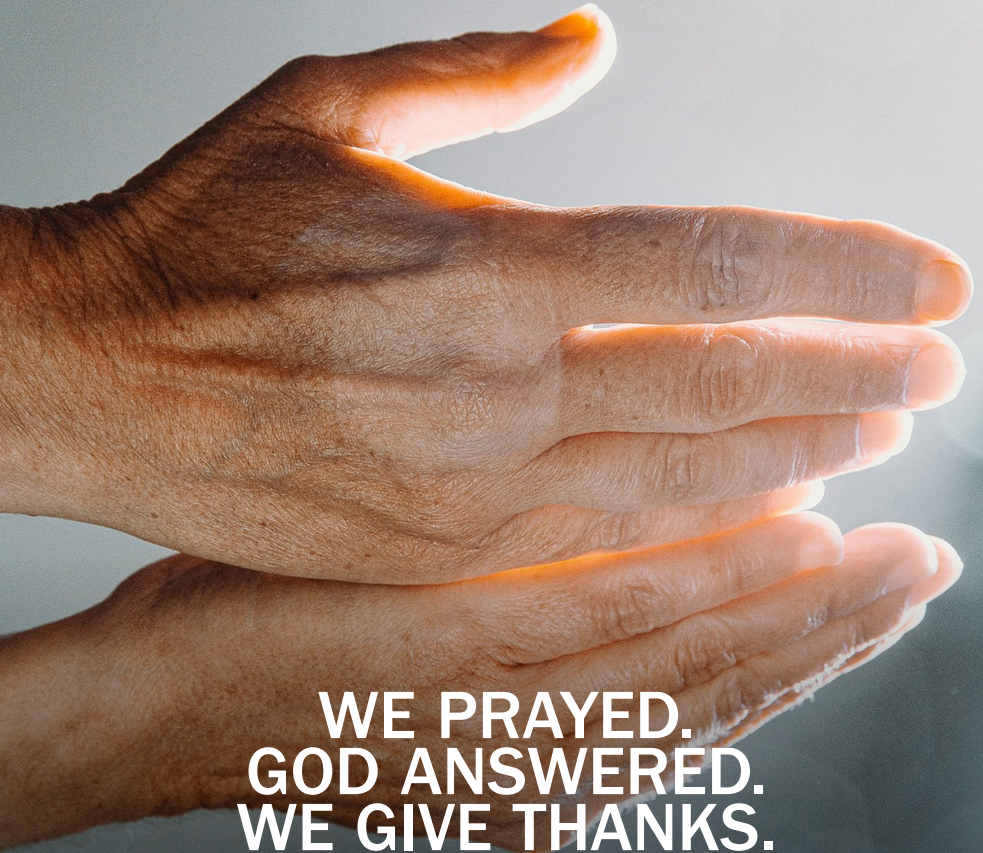

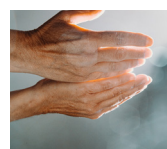

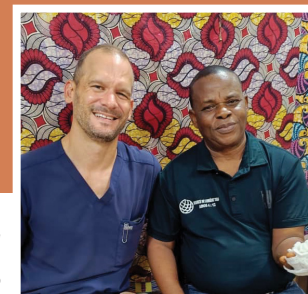
One of our core values at SLM is and always has been prayer. We pray in faith; we pray expecting to hear answers from God; and we pray constantly. Colossians 4:2 is our basis for this: “Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving.”

Apparently, you too have been committed to this with us, because we have seen many answers to prayer. Most of us don’t follow up as well with answers to prayers as well as we do to present the needs. This *Reaper* is dedicated to doing just

But there have also been many answers to prayer besides financial ones, and I’d like to highlight just a few.

We have seen God heal:

The yellow fever of Daniel in Ghana, the infection of Sika’s finger in Togo, the ulcers in James in Uganda, the dangerous eclampsia of the Vanegas’ daughter in Colombia, and the recent sickness of Sanjeeb in India.

We have seen progress in the medical situations of:

Brian Thompson, Brian Trapp, Melody Zink, Shirley Rice, Jim Tilson, and Philip Fraiser (from the home office along with many others). Internationally, God has helped Hemanth in India, Adil in Portugal, Alice and Samuel in Brazil, Joe in Canada, Lediz in Bolivia, and Isaiah in the Ivory Coast.

We have seen God open new doors in:

Peru among the deaf, Brazil among new churches, Spain with new missionaries, the Philippines in government offices, Portugal among prisoners, and new Associate Discipleship Schools around the globe. Also, South Africa using online lessons due to the shutdown of the postal service and the use of online lessons in countries we don’t currently serve in.

We rejoice to see ministry cross borders into:

Uruguay, Ecuador, Venezuela, Burkina Faso, Benin, Malawi, Somalia, Italy,

Ireland, Iran, Vietnam, Nepal, Cuba, Nicaragua, Panama, Belize, Jordan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, and Malaysia.

We give thanks for protection from:

Persecution in India, Nigeria, Pakistan, and Indonesia, flooding in Mozambique, gangs in Haiti, unreasonable taxes in Kenya and Jamaica for shipments, and the cartel in Mexico.

New leadership is being prepared in:

Chile, Japan, the Philippines, India, and the Ivory Coast.

These are all requests you have been asked to pray for, and God has seen fit to answer above and beyond our wildest imagination. So, thank you for praying on our behalf. Thank you for asking others to join in. And thank you for partnering with us in the Gospel.

It is our desire that this edition of *The Reaper* honors God and honors those of you who prayed . . . and gave! God bless you! 🌿

TECHNOLOGY AND TOOLS WITH A THEOLOGY OF THANKS

The earth is the LORD's, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.

(Psalm 24:1)

We might consider this verse more in reference to things God has directly made, but it is just as true with things men have thought they made. Such is the difficulty squaring technology with theology. How should we view the things we use to do things for the Lord? We thank Him, for they are His, just the same. Especially in this epoch of time when apparent technological advances seem to be happening at blistering speed, we often feel unprepared to use new tools and means rightly. Just like the builders at Babel (See Genesis 11:1-9), we have goals and aspirations, and we expect the newest and fastest equipment will get us where we need to go. We might have good plans to “go into such a city, and continue there a year” and do something profitable but often quickly learn that our collection of nifty tricks “appeareth for a little time and then vanisheth” and we are sometimes corrected that our “rejoicing in our boastings . . . is evil.” Truly, instead we “ought to say, ‘If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that’” (James 4:13-16).

Even with the best of intentions, the gifts we are given at Source of Light or in any area of life always run the risk of fulfilling

the opposite of their best purpose. Are we looking to achieve personal success? Whether it be money or ministry. Are we building our own kingdom? Of followers or maybe just stories. The tools could be used for the wrong task. And the most frightening part is, we might not even know it (See Jeremiah 17:9). It is with this warning firmly in mind that we take space in this *Reaper* to announce to the world our intended purpose for such gifts: the glory of God and the good of the Gospel.

Probably the two most significant areas of change over the last several decades are with travel and technology. Though a reliable vehicle and a laptop computer might be as common as napkins in the USA, they are simply not in other parts of the world. Both are merely tools and as we might quickly take for granted, are needed for our Branches to do ministry most effectively. Here are some excerpts of what recent gifts have meant for SLM staff:

The Discipleship Training Branch in Orissa, India recently had an addition to leadership and a hope toward expansion of the ministry. They were praying for a motorbike, a common and efficient means of transportation there, to reach more places. God answered their prayer in January of 2023. B.P. shares, “Now it is helping me to visit different mission fields.” In turn, he “had no computer for office work and our teaching ministry.” But this past April at the SLM regional conference, they received a laptop. “Now it is a great help.”

Similar needs had been met elsewhere in India, particularly for K. & S. based out of Kolkata. Public transport is often an option, but in many places none is available or taking literature not allowed. God provided a car in September of 2022.

They share, “This is helping us in a greater way to reach out to many people and make disciples ... Our fields are scattered in many far places, so this car is helping to connect to the people and places.”

Another factor we rarely face in the United States? The danger of persecution. Having a ministry vehicle not only allows for smoother but also safer work.

Also, “God provided some bicycles to the Gospel outreach teams ... They are able to carry the literature to the villages and slums.”

With no other options in these places, the bicycles are especially essential. K. also details, “God has provided us a laptop computer which is helping me to teach in the discipleship conference and leadership trainings.”

“Praise God for this wonderful gift ... Thank you for your prayer and support.”



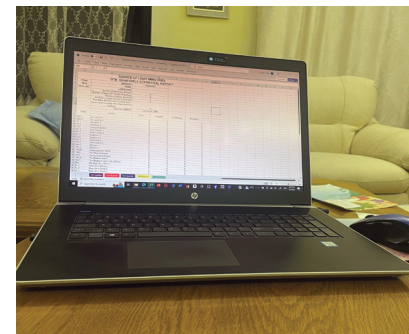

Traveling westward to SLM Romania, Cristian Oprea notes they have “been blessed in the last couple of years with means for the ministry.” In January of 2022, donations received “made it possible to buy a decent car” which had multiple uses, especially to “carry a large volume of goods and booklets.” It has already been used for development, and they “plan to enlarge the ministry more by means of this.” Back in 2019, they received a laptop for ministry and essential communication with SLM headquarters, even such as recorded here! “We praise the Lord.”

Heading south to Brazil we often heard the report from our National Director there, Samuel Milanez, who repeatedly struggled to successfully complete ministry trips due to chronic car breakdowns. Following provision of a more dependable vehicle, he reports, “With this car, I have arrived faster, and I have arrived easier at the churches where I have presented Source of Light. The GPS has put me on streets where I thank God I no longer have the old car, which was a blessing, but it would not be able to face those streets.”

Of course, the needs are not only overseas. Even for staff serving at Headquarters in Madison, a vehicle problem can be tenuous, though sometimes answered by God’s doubling blessing. As Brian Thompson testifies, “Since we have been in Madison working for SLM, we have been given two different vehicles, both by the same family ... In all we have been missionaries for over 25 years and He has always met our needs.”

Not only does Source of Light seek to “provide the tools to finish the task,” we are glad when we have the tools we feel we could use to do so. God has, again and again, blessed us. Sometimes it’s only what we need and little more. Sometimes it’s newer or better. We carry on either way, giving thanks and using means, Lord-willing, for His righteous purposes. 🌿

HELP ON THE HOMEFRONT

Source of Light is blessed to have partners who are concerned and burdened to partner with missionaries and projects around the globe. But sometimes the needs right here at our home office get neglected. We tend to get as much use as we can out of our resources, but occasionally the lifespan of this equipment has run its course. Two such current projects we have are below:

Vehicles: Our fleet of vehicles has reached its limit, and so we are looking for two things: \$20,000 for a specific type of van that would suit our needs and either funds or a donation of a small, midsize car or SUV.

VOIP Phone System: Our phone system lacks significant elements that have become standard in the current work environment and thus we are looking to upgrade to a more functional system employing greater reliability and usefulness. The system to replace our current one is estimated to cost \$10,000.



BUT I DON'T HAVE A BIBLE

Can you imagine giving a small lesson to a child about Jesus and telling them they can read more about Jesus in the Bible, but then the child tells you they don't have a Bible?

The few verses included in a SLM lesson might be the only ones a schoolchild—or even a village pastor—has.

When one of our new fields mentioned that they would really like a set of chronological Bible stories for their dynamic work with children, I got so excited. I had written the text for a series of such material decades ago that was never fully used. We dug it out, did a major edit, added some content, and it was ready to be turned into brand new material for Source of Light.

The new CHILDREN'S BIBLE STORY SERIES is a 104-lesson study of some of the Bible's most important stories. These lessons are different than SLM's standard material. Rather than booklets with tests that get returned by a mentor, the Bible story set will be individual fold-over sheets that can be used as handouts in Sunday school or the classroom each week.

Each lesson has the Bible story, a few short questions, two memory verses, an application section, and one core truth to remember.

Source of Light wanted to offer this material for free online so our fields—or anyone—could download and print them. The material would be offered for free. The creation of it, however, would not be.

We sent the word out to friends and prayer supporters. Two fellow laborers shared it in their newsletters as well.

The response brought us great delight. Gifts came in from supporters,

friends we haven't heard from in decades, retired missionaries, homeschool moms, even strangers. I was deeply humbled when one of the largest gifts came from one of SLM's national missionary partners, who I know has gone hungry in the past for the sake of the Gospel.

None of the over four thousand dollars given came from a church or organization. Every dollar came from individuals—from as little as \$10 sent through the mail—each one surely a sweet-smelling sacrifice, acceptable and well-pleasing to God. (See Philippians 4:17-20).

Right now, more money has come in than was needed, so we will even be able to help with some translation or printing costs. God has provided a great team of editors also, all online volunteers. We love seeing God's people come together to do something great for Him!

People are already asking for this material. Lord willing, the full set will be available online when the new SLM KIDS website comes out.

We can't wait to see what God does! 🌸

India, a land overflowing with people who have yet to hear the Gospel message, many of whom are burdened with physical and economic hardships that compound their spiritual blindness. For Christ followers, the directive to show compassion to the poor is clear, whether it be to see them and give generously of our possessions as we are reminded in the book of Proverbs or the admonishment in the letter from James to provide for physical needs and not only verbalize empty blessings. Within this context a partnership was established between generous friends of Source of Light and the faithful ministry of S. and A. in northern India. As S. shares, "Our main intention is to help women who are below the poverty line, to teach them a skill which will later help them to earn their own living."

S. and A. are filled with gratitude for how God has provided for this ministry through burdening the hearts of donors to give toward the purchase of 12 sewing machines. Through these gifts, 31 women have learned how to use the machines to sew women's and children's dresses, with plans for leaders to teach in a new

place in the coming weeks. Not only are the sewing machines used for outreach, but they have been a special blessing to ladies in the church as well, some of whom have recently started a new crafting and sewing business making paper and cloth bags. No doubt the skills learned by these women will be passed on to others, creating a ripple effect of hope, just like the tangible gifts of God's people, coupled with intentional relationship building in communities in India work together to create a catalyst for the Gospel to go forth. To God be all the glory as each of us open our eyes to see the needs around us and give generously as He wills, vessels of mercy and kindness, drawing attention to the Giver of Life. 🌸

Our team in the States began to pray and to share the need, and in nearly the time it took to receive quotes for both the construction and the machine for printing, we had commitments to cover the cost for both. By the time this *Reaper* gets distributed, we anticipate construction on the office will be complete and the process of securing a machine and printing training will have begun. We also expect that soon hundreds of pastors and pastors-in-training will have access to the SLM resources that we have already begun introducing and training on there.

A quick timeline like this can only be explained by a team of prayer warriors committed equally as we are to see new Source of Light Branches established around the world. God answered... when we prayed for Zambia. 🌿

BEFORE YOU KNEW WHAT TO PRAY PRINTING IN UGANDA

Deep inside, James Byakika had privately been wondering if God would have him print the SLM lessons from within Uganda. In Africa, our experience had been that the English lessons can be printed in the US and shipped significantly cheaper than printing in-country. Printing in-country also requires a lot of help and the equipment to do so, which generally has been the biggest cost.

So, when James contacted the SLM administration about the feasibility of purchasing a Risograph machine and printing in Uganda, we agreed to commit this to prayer, and he committed to due diligence as to costs and help needed to print.

After a number of meetings, it seemed we had enough information gathered to determine that it might be financially feasible enough to justify the purchase of the Riso and the supplies to print in Uganda. So, when James then began the process of presenting a project proposal, I happily reminded him that in his publication account, a large gift was given that would cover the cost of the machine and some of the printing for 2024.

Before we even knew to pray for a machine, God provided the funds. This meant James could proceed immediately, and within days of our conversation, he was printing his first lessons. Thank you for those of you who pray, sometimes for what you know and for wisdom for what you don't. And thank you to those of you who give as God puts it on your heart, even when you don't know the specifics. 🌿

The characteristic jovial smile, antics, and laughter Sika usually exhibits had been replaced with a long bout of discouragement, pain, and sadness. A small discomfort in his finger soon became a severe infection in his hand, which caused Sika to lose a portion of a finger and nearly resulted in Sika losing his life. His life was spared thanks to the American missionaries at the ABWE hospital in Togo.

Lucie already had been suffering with her own health issues when the market where she was working caught fire, which resulted in her having severe respiratory issues. It is taking a long time for them to heal, and Sika recalled to me that

Sika and Lucie still continue to heal and are optimistic about complete healing. If God answered the prayer for a vehicle that can take them to the ends of the earth, then He surely will keep them healthy enough to drive it there. 🌿

New Printers

God is wonderful, and He provides what is necessary for His work. Our task is to believe in Him and obey Him. God is the owner of everything, and He magnifies His work amidst the times. This truth has been very real for us in the last two years, where the Fuente de Luz Ministry has been blessed in Costa Rica and beyond its borders. Our “island ministry” now has its own printer to print Fuente de Luz courses. Since 2023, thanks to this printer, children, young people, and adults can learn about God and His Word on this island. And not only this “island ministry” has had this benefit but also our neighboring country, Panama, because they also received a printer to supply themselves with the courses. In this way, more people can study the Bible in an organized and consistent manner and become true disciples of Christ.

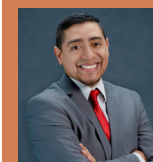

GOD'S VALENTINE TO ME

While serving as a missionary in the Democratic Republic of Congo, I developed a goiter in my thyroid. The doctor did a biopsy and told me that because of “abnormal cells,” they recommended thyroid removal. I was hesitant to go this route. My husband, Brian, had returned to Africa before me, and I was in the States with our two children. We were monitoring our debt closely and had just taken some measures to resolve debt. I was especially concerned when the insurance company started calling me with concerns about covering the surgery. I really wanted this resolved before the surgery, because I did not want to take the chance of the cost not being covered and once again face a problem with debt. I told them that it had to be clarified and resolved before the surgery. I did not want to proceed if there was any doubt that the insurance would pay.

On the day of my pre-op appointment, once again a red flag was raised. I told the girl that I could not agree to have the surgery if there was any question about the insurance paying. She left the desk and called the insurance company again. When she returned to the desk, she said, “It has been resolved. You need to write a check for this amount, and the account will be paid in full.” I did so, had the surgery, and just days later, I was on a plane to Africa.

After returning to Africa, my power of attorney in the US began sending me emails. She said that she was getting huge bills from the hospital. I said, “That can’t be. They told me everything was paid in full.” After phone calls to the States, I discovered that, in the end, the insurance hadn’t paid. I remember lying on the couch in the living room of our home and sobbing when I received the news. As I lay there, God assured my heart that nothing was too difficult for Him.

I appealed the claim with the insurance company and appealed to the hospital, but to no avail. Even after the hospital gave us a self-pay discount, we would owe over \$20,000. I had done everything I could to avoid this situation, and here I was—stuck!

I began paying. Throughout the years, I continued to appeal to the hospital and write letters. The surgery occurred in 2008. After years of service in Africa, we returned to the US and were invited by Source of Light to serve at Headquarters. In 2022, 14 years after the surgery, Brian and I had a little extra money in our ministry account that we could use for doctor bills. I began to wonder if I could get the hospital to do a settlement with me. I would offer them a lump sum, much smaller than the bill, if they would settle for that amount.

I called the hospital. The girl on the line told me that in my case a settlement wasn’t possible. I almost gave up at that point. But again, I felt prompted to write to someone. I went online and wrote to the CEO of the hospital. I explained my situation, as I had done many times in the past. One evening, a short time after having sent the email, I was at home and received a phone call. The CEO of the hospital was on the line. She said, “Mrs.

Trapp, I think you have been dealing with this long enough. You will receive a call from our billing department in a few days so that we can resolve this issue.” As she promised, the billing department called and confirmed that my settlement had been accepted. She took my payment, and my account was cleared. God had worked, just as He assured me He would. And you will never guess the last name of the CEO! Her last name was Valentine! God had sent me a special valentine, and he had used Ms. Valentine! I heard through the grapevine that Ms. Valentine recently retired from that hospital. Just at the right time, God had her in the position to get me the help I needed.

God is good. 🌿

was required just to learn how to walk again on a flat surface. Our house had at least five steps to get inside, which Anna Gay could not do. We committed this problem to God, asking for wisdom in how to deal with this challenge. Folks at a local church, Centennial Baptist, heard of our dilemma and offered to help. Funds had previously been collected to build a ramp for a need in the church which never materialized, so they offered to use those funds to build a ramp for us. A crew from the church came with materials and within a few days constructed a wooden ramp. And they did not charge us a penny! What a blessing from the Lord! Just a few days after the ramp was built, I brought Anna Gay home from the hospital and helped her shuffle her walker up that beautiful ramp. God's timing and provision was perfect! 🍂

- ◆ SLM Togo is praising the Lord for a new vehicle provided for them through a sister mission organization. It enables them to reach remote areas where they are eager to evangelize and disciple new believers.
